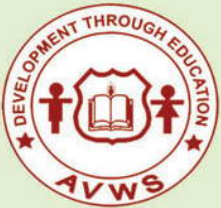

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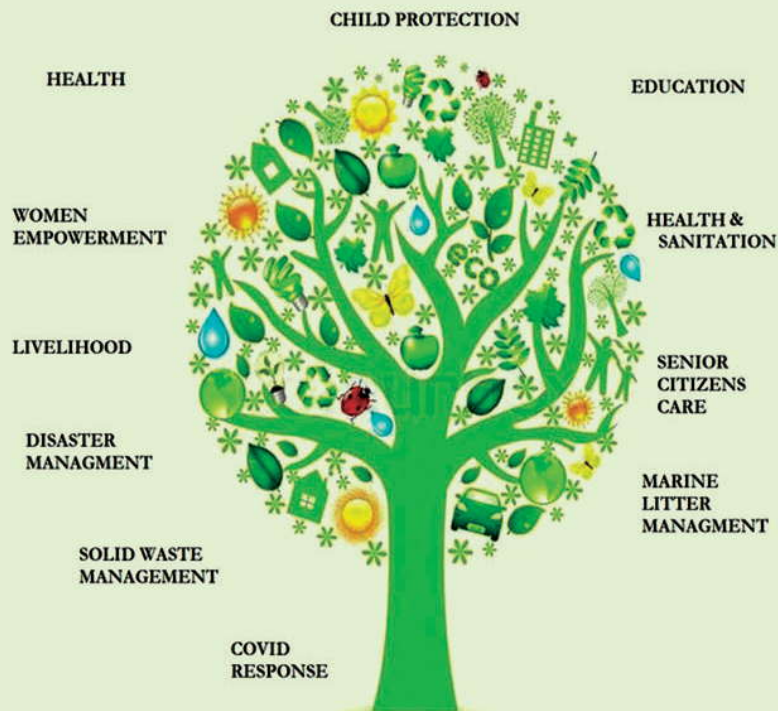

## National Creche Scheme :

### Goal :

Promote Day Care facilities for children below 5 years by providing nutrition and play way education in a healthy atmosphere in Nagapattinam district.

### Objectives :

- To provide a healthy atmosphere for children below 5 years
- To provide nutritious food and play way education to children
- To network with Primary Health Center and provide adequate medical facilities for children
- To conduct parents meeting every month and get the community involved in the management and monitoring of Activities, especially providing infrastructure, clean water, toilet and cooking facilities

### Activities :

1. At this reporting year, 452 children were supported with nutrition and play way education through running 15 creche centers in Nagapattinam District.
2. The parents were sensitized on COVID preventive measures and creche centers were kept with COVID protocol as guided by the district administration.
3. The children were engaged in activity based learning by using comprehensive tools such as colourful charts, pictures, play materials and numbers.
4. In coordination with nearby Primary Health Centres, the children were immunized properly and given Vitamin A solution. Moreover, through Village Health Nurse, sensitized mothers on nutrition and anemia and good parenting.
5. Organized periodical meetings to Local Committees represented by Village panchayat, local NGO representative, Village Health Nurse and Parents on creche management.
6. Ensured periodical visits of Village Health Nurse to creche centers and to the villages to carryout health related activities and awareness on COVID-19 .
7. Anganwadi Day, World Children's Day and other important days were observed such as Independence Day, Republic Day etc and given prizes by conducting competition and games.



### Impact :

452 children obtained supplementary nutrition and education for better future. The mothers were sensitized on good parenting and importance of immunization. The project in association with local stakeholders and Primary Health Center caters the need and enroll eligible children in nearby school to continue their primary education successfully.



## Nagapattinam Childline 1098

### Goal :

Facilitate the functioning of Childline-1098 to help the children in need of Care & Protection in Nagapattinam District

### Objectives :

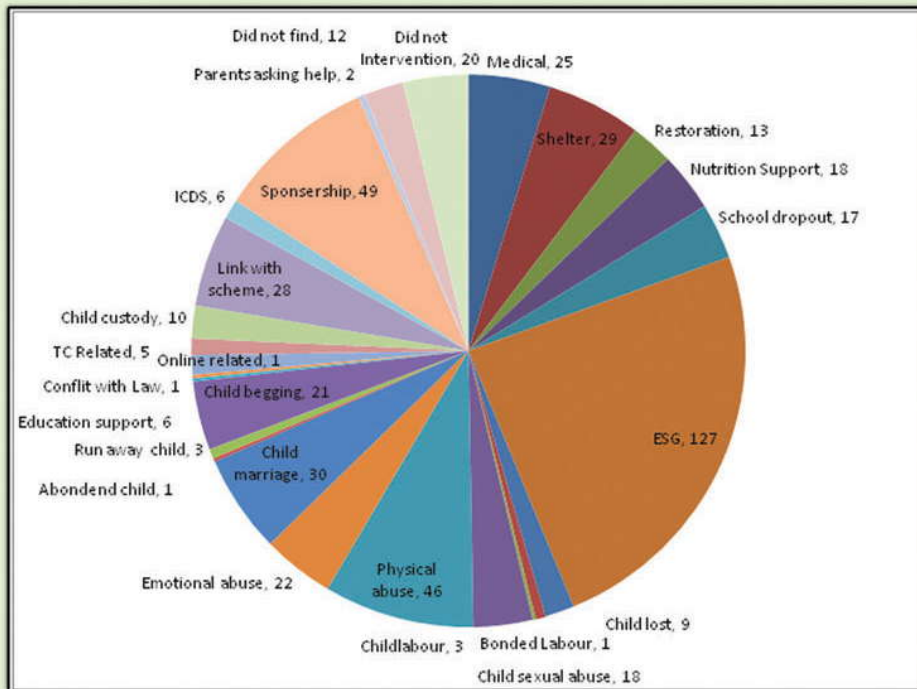
- To rescue and support for rehabilitation of children in need of care and protection in coordination with allied departments
- To create and sustain awareness about childline 1098 and its activities through open houses, publicity materials, linkages, school campaign, sensitization etc
- To work in collaborative with allied systems the NGOs, CBOs, SHGs, Child Welfare Committee, District Child Protection Unit (DCPU) etc., to facilitate best service to children

### Activities :

1. Nagapattinam Childline 1098 has received 523 calls and out of that 491 are Intervention calls.
2. Besides Rescue operation, 1398 awareness & outreach programmes were conducted and reached 14910 people from different target communities.
3. Sensitized 64 school children on child protection measures by using thematic IEC materials and covered 7899 children.
4. 808 phone testing was done and ensured good connectivity of tele communication.
5. Organized Childline Advisory Board (CAB) meeting under the leadership of the District Collector Nagapattinam and it enhanced smooth relationship between Childline 1098 and allied departments on addressing children in need of care and protection.
6. Massive awareness events were organized as part of Se-dhosti and covered 936 people from different walks of life. The District Collector, Superintendent of Police, District Legal Service Authority, Child Protection Officer and other stakeholders were presided.
7. Anti Child labour Day and Girl Child Day were organized by joining hands with related Govt. departments and sensitized 948 people about the significance of the Day and distributed prizes by conducting various competitions.
8. The project strengthened its relationship with various allied departments on addressing children in distress such as Police, Dept. of Telecommunication, Hospitals, Swadhar greh, Child Welfare Committee, Juvenile Justice Board, Social Welfare Dept, ICDS, Dept of Labour Welfare, District Legal Service Authority and other agencies working for the cause of deprived, excluded and vulnerable children.



9. 09 Open House programmes were organized and sensitized the village stakeholders through children participation and addressed issues pertaining to child marriage, child sexual abuse, child labour and school dropouts. Totally 375 were participated and given support.
10. Childline India Foundation has organized trainings and zoom meetings by online and sensitized the staff team on new intervention forms, strategies of child marriage & bonded labour and did oneline review of the project.
11. Organized Childline 25th year of celebration at massive level at Nagapattinam in coordination with Nodal organization and allied department and thereby 128 were participated.
12. Participated in NCPCR meeting held under the chairmanship of the District Collector at collectorate, Nagapattinam and shared about the cases received to Nagapattinam Childline 1098.



### Impact :

At this reporting period, the Nagapattinam Childline-1098 reached 11155 children and 13648 public through outreach, awareness and celebration of important days and mass events. The project successfully intervened with 491 children and ensured rehabilitation with the support of allied departments. The project also promoted very good rapport with Govt. department on extending timely intervnetion and rehabilitation of children in distress.

## “Adaikalam” Swadhar Greh

### Goal :

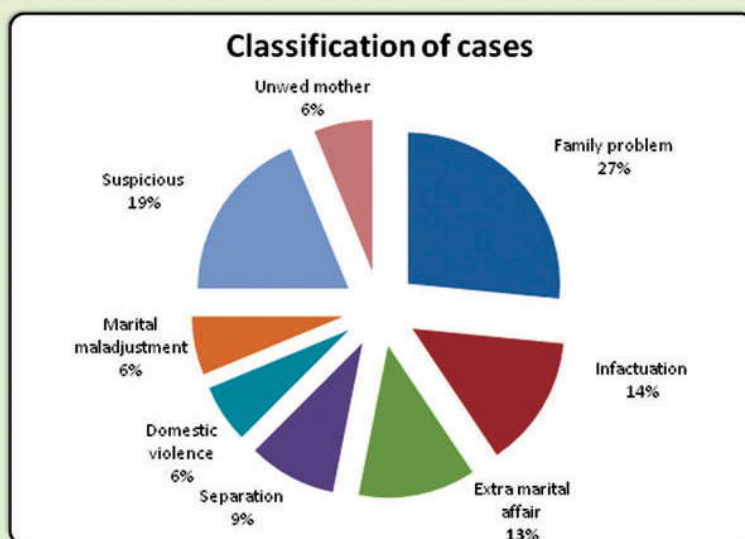
Ensuring holistic development of women and girls under distress through counseling and Rehabilitation measures in Nagapattinam District

### Objectives :

- To create social awareness on care for the homeless and the abandoned
- To ensure safe and healthy atmosphere for women and girls under distress
- To provide them information on self reliance legal matters and rehabilitation
- To establish network with other Free Legal Aid, NGOs and other Government Departments

### Activities :

1. 64 women in distress and their 22 children were supported with peaceful shelter, food, counselling assistance, yoga and recreation. At this reporting period, 38 women were newly admitted and 37 were reunited with family members successfully. At present there were 27 women.
2. The residents were referred to Swadhar Greh by All women Poilce Station, Child Welfare Committee, One Stop Centre, Self Help Group, Village Health Nurse, Rehabilitated residents and Childline 1098.



3. Out of 37 rehabilitated, 02 of them restored to parents, 06 of them restored with spouse, 20 of them supported to obtain Legal sup port from District legal Service Authority, 02 of them referred to Domestic Violence Protection Officerand 07 of them referred to One Stop Centre for further support and followup.
4. Conducted 12 medical camps with the suport of Apollo medicines, Nagore Primary Health Centre and HelpAge India. The residents were support with free medicines and treatment.
5. Legal counselling was organized with the support of District Legal Service Authority, Nagapattinam for the residents and thereby 20 of them sought legal support.
6. Conducted 30 awareness meetings at community level and sensitized self help groups, police personnel and other general public on women rights, domestic violence act, functions of women helpline, One stop centre etc and thereby 1896 were benefited.



## Avvai Village Welfare Society

- Vocational trainings were provided to residents on tailoring, embroidering, basket making, cover making and flower garland. 08 residents were self-employed after discharge from the Home.
- Celebrated important days and festivals such as Diwali, Pongal, Vinayakar Sathurthi, Republic day, Independence day, Ayudha Pooja and Women's Day along with District stakeholders and given prizes.
- 04 Home Management Committee meetings were organized and delt need of residents require legal support. The District Social Welfare Officer and DLSA were presided.
- The children of residents were supported to admit in Anganwadi centre and School at Palpannaicherry for continuing his/her education.
- District Collector, District social welfare officer, District Supply Officer, Deputy Director, of Health Services, All women Police Station Inspector and One staff centre officials were visited the project and given guidance.



### Impact :

The project successfully reunited 37 deserted inmates with their family members through counseling process and made them self-employed by providing vocational skill. In addition, the Project sensitized on women rights and promoted healthy relationship with line departments on addressing women under difficult circumstances.

## “Vidiyal” Family Counseling Center

### Goal :

Promoting harmonious family life among people living in Nagapattinam District

### Objectives :

- To minimize family problem arising out of alcoholism ,domestic violence, dowry problem, etc...in Nagapattinam district.
- To provide information on legal rights on women and link women with resources locally available.
- To establish linkages with the police departments, DLSA, DSW, hospitals, NGOs, CBOs, etc to address issues together.

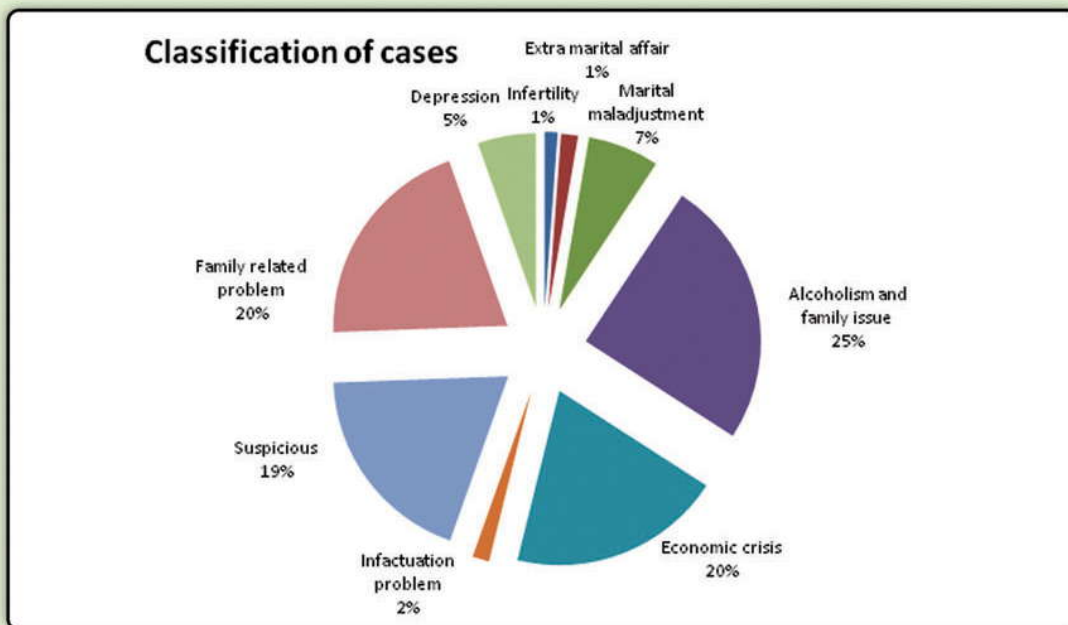
### Activities :

- At this reporting period, the Vidiyal – Family Counselling Centre extended counselling support to 258 cases out of that 224 were rehabilitated successfully.

Done 158 home visits and 89 follow up and ensured welfare of cases rehabilitated through family counseling center.



3. Besides counselling support, the project did 52 awareness programmes on women rights along with the support of District Legal Service Authority, All Women Police Station, District Court and District Social Welfare Office, Nagapattinam. As a result, 1478 members were participated and benefited.
4. Attended court cases and extended counselling support to 16 family issues.
5. As part of rehabilitation, the Vidiyal –Family Counselling Centre referred 07 cases to Swadhar Greh, 11 to DLSA and 64 to Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts.
6. As per the guidance of Tamil Nadu Social Welfare Board and Secretary of Social Welfare, the project sensitized 432 public on COVID preventive measures by organizing 05 awareness programmes.
7. Organized 02 subcommittee meeting and discussed about the pending cases and strategies to strengthen the project in coordination with allied department.
8. The Joint Secretary from Tamil Nadu State Social Welfare Board and District Social Welfare Officer, Nagapattinam were visited the project and given guidance.



### Impact :

The Vidiyal - Family counseling centre felt proud for extending counseling support to 258 cases and for rehabilitating 224 cases successfully. The counsellors were well trained and there is very good coordination with All Women Police Station, District Social Welfare Office, DLSA and District Court on dealing various family issues. The centre also satisfied of its services rendered for poor and vulnerable through counseling and rehabilitation measures to lead a happy and dignified life.

## “ANUBHAVAM” Home for Senior Citizens

### Goal :

Enhancing health status, social relationship and self esteem of the vulnerable elders by providing peaceful home shelter care and social awareness.

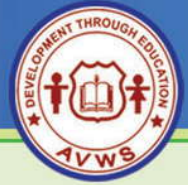
### Objectives :

- To enhance social awareness on elder care in the community
- To carryout social, psychological and material assistance to needy elders
- To identify neglected and socially handicapped elders in the communities
- To provide a healthy family environment to the elders admitted in home
- To ensure nutritional, medical, entertainment and other preliminary needs of elders in the home.
- To engage in resource mobilization activities.

### Activities :

1. Anubhavam Home for Senior Citizens has provided peaceful home shelter and lovable care to 46 senior citizens out of that 09 male and 37 female. At this reporting period, 06 senior citizens were newly admitted (3 male and 3 female) and 06 were discharged (02 male and 04 female) At present there are 40 residents at Home.
2. As per State Government and District administration guidelines, the project adhered to COVID protocol and ensured complete vaccination to all residents through COVID Vaccination camp at Home.
3. Conducted 12 medical camps and 40 residents were participated. Apart from medical camps, periodical health checkup were held in coordination with Primary Health Centre & HelpAge India once in a month. The project thank Apollo for extending free medicine and COVID 19 hygiene kits.
4. The project in coordination with Arvind Eye Hospital and Rotary wings organized Eye camp and thereby 15 residents were underwent eye checkups out of that 03 residents selected and undergone eye operation successfully.
5. Promoted kitchen garden at Home and the residents happily engaged on watering the plants, plucking vegetables and gathering at free time for leisure. The green garden entertains residents to feel connected with nature.





6. The project leveraged material donations like household materials and entertainment items. The kind hearted donors were thanked in person and through letter communication.
7. Celebrated World Women's Day programme and honoured female residents who have participated and won in various competitions organized by the project. The All Women Police Station Inspector, Nagapattinam Area Commendor, Red Cross Joint Secretary and National School Teacher were presided.
8. Newspaper reading, watching television programs, hearing radio, cleaning home environment, carrom, chess, musical chair, ball game and group singing are some of the periodical entertainment activities conducted at Home. The inmates forget their worries and interestingly involved in these activities.
9. The residents were engaged in yoga periodically with trained yoga master. The yoga helped residents to get relief from breathing trouble, knee pain and made them relax and comfort.
10. The project leveraged Old Age Pension for 33 elders and applied for 7 elders this year from Govt.
11. District Collector, Nagapattinam, District Social Welfare Officer, Doctor from TB Department, Railway Protection Force officer and Taluk Supply Officer were visited the project and given guidance.
12. As a precautionary measures of COVID 19, the project in coordination with local Government Hospital conducted awareness meet, given herbal drinks, sanitized the premises and provided mask and sanitizers to all the inmates.
13. important days and festivals such as Diwali, Pongal , Vinayahar Sathurthi, Republic day, Independence day, NGO Day, World Elders Day and Ayudha Pooja along with community members and crèche children. The elders feel at home and enjoy the day with school children and community people.

### **Impact :**

The project satisfied for extending its peaceful home shelter care for 46 residents. Health drinks, yoga, health camps, recreation activities, nutrition support, kitchen garden, celebration of important days, get-together meeting, and spiritual gathering improved physical and mental wellbeing of residents and promoted a good we-feeling.

## “Ambujam” Home for Senior Citizens

### Goal :

Enhancing health status, social relationship and self esteem of the vulnerable elders by providing peaceful home shelter care and social awareness.

### Objectives :

- To enhance social awareness on elder care in the community
- To carryout social, psychological and material assistance to needy elders
- To identify neglected and socially handicapped elders in the communities
- To provide a healthy family environment to the elders admitted in home
- To ensure nutritional, medical, entertainment and other preliminary needs of elders in the home.
- To engage in resource mobilization activities.

### Activities :

1. The project extended its lovable care to 37 residents with free shelter, food, medicine, recreation, counselling assistance and yoga. Out of that (Male 13 & Female 24).
2. 10 Elders were reunited with their families and 02 of them expired due to oldage. At present, 25 elders were taken care and given homely atmosphere.
3. Doctors from TB department, Nagapattinam organized camp and screened all residents and found every one free from TB.

4. All residents were vaccinated against COVID successfully with the support of Thevour Primary Health Centre, Kilvelur Block, Nagapattinam District.

Periodical yoga classess and NISD Online training helped

5. the residents to practice yoga daily and to keep their body and soul healthy.

The project organized 11 medical camps in collaboration with local Govt. Hospital & HelpAge India. All the residents obtained free medicines and treatment for the ailments. The project thanked Apollo for extending free medicine and COVID 19 hygiene kits.

7. Periodical counselling session, story telling, indoor games, get-together meeting, and talent show were enriched residents to feel at home.

8. The elders were engaged in preparing basket making and gardening as a recreation and entertainment activities. Television, daily newspaper and outings were being recreation for elders.

9. Importance Days and Events were celebrated and observed like Pongal, Diwali, Independence Day, Republic Day, NGO Day, World TB Day, Water Day and World Elders Day in coordination with District Administration, Rotary club, Red Cross and local stakeholders. Musical chair, rangoli and cultural programmes were conducted and given prizes.





10. As a precautionary measures of COVID 19, the project in coordination with local govt. hospital verified temperature of inmates periodically, conducted awareness meet, given herbal drinks, sanitized the premises and provided mask and sanitizers to all the inmates.
11. The project built new building as an additional facility to residents at Manalmedu. The Nagapattinam District Collector inaugurated the building and appreciated for caring the deserved residents. Mr. Pappaiyan, President and local stakeholders from Panchayat Union were participated.
12. The District Social Welfare Officer, Block Development Officer, Member of Legislative Assembly Kilvelur, Revenue Divisional Officer, Thasildar, Civil Supply Officer, MSJE and Extension Officer were visited the Home, interacted with residents and given guidance.
13. The project mobilized material donations like clothes, groceries and recreational items from the community and CBOs like Rotary Club, Self Help Groups and individual donors.



### Impact :

The new building added advantage for enhancing additional facilities for the residents of Ambujam Home for Senior Citizens. The residents feel at home and enjoy each day by involving in various activities organized by the project. The get-together meeting, yoga, counselling assistance, medical support and spritual meetings add strength and stamina to lead a dignified life.

## “Annapoorani” Home for Senior Citizen

### Goal :

Enhancing health status, social relationship and self esteem of the vulnerable elders by providing peaceful home shelter care and social awareness.

### Objectives :

- To enhance social awareness on elder care in the community
- To carryout social, psychological and material assistance to needy elders
- To identify neglected and socially handicapped elders in the communities
- To provide a healthy family environment to the elders admitted in home
- To ensure nutritional, medical, entertainment and other preliminary needs of elders in the home.
- To engage in resource mobilization activities

### Activities :

1. The Home extended its lovable support to 32 deserved and neglected senior citizens by providing shelter, food, recreation, counselling assistance, yoga and medical support at free of cost.
2. At this year 2021-22, 07 senior citizens were newly admitted, 07 were reunited with family members.

3. 10 medical camps were organized and provided free medicines and treatment services. The camps were organized in coordination with local primary health services.
4. 144 yoga sessions were organized and all senior citizens actively participated and kept their body and soul healthy.
5. Recreational activities such as carrom, chess, pallanguzhi, indoor games, musical chair, gardening and talent show made them brisk and active whole day.
6. World Elders' Day was observed and thereby competitions, games and prize distribution functions were held. The senior citizens actively participated in cultural programmes and enjoyed.
7. The Spiritual meetings, healthy food and counselling support strengthen the residents' body and soul sound and leading a healthy and dignified life.
8. Conducted 12 awareness programmes on elder care and thereby 640 people were participated and got sensitized. The local stakeholders found the Home as boon to their district to care for the vulnerable elders.
9. District Judge, Ariyalur, MSJE, District Social Welfare Officer were visited the project and given guidance.



### Impact :

The Annapoorani Home for Senior Citizen at Ariyalur district caters the need of 32 deserted and neglected elders by providing lovable services such as shelter, food, medicine, counselling, recreation, yoga and spiritual value to lead a dignified life. The residents feel at home and enjoy the days by involving in various events organized by the project. The project satisfied for the opportunity given to care the deserted and neglected elders with lovable services.

## Pudhumalar – Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts

### Goal :

Rehabilitation of Drug addicts in Nagapattinam District through Medical and psychological treatment and to make it as sober.

### Objectives :

- To enrich knowledge on ill-effect of alcoholism through mass communication
- To increase the number of services rendered to alcoholic cases by 20% in one year
- To continuously assist recovered cases through periodical meetings and Alcoholic Anonymous to maintain sobriety.
- To network with related Departments and CBOs and to strengthen the services of the programme

### Activities :

1. Admitted 172 drug addicts and provided medical and psychological treatment. Out of 172 cases, 144 are leading drug free life.

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2. Conducted 1932 Individual Counseling, 248 Group therapy, 50 Family therapy and 144 yoga therapy for drug addicts and facilitated for successful treatment.
3. 172 home visits and 191 follow up were made to prevent relapse. Totally 144 cases were fully recovered at this year.
4. Sensitized Self Help Groups, Panchayat members and general public on IRCA programme and on ill-effect of addiction and thereby 751 members were participated in 26 programmes and got benefited.
5. The project staff underwent capacity building on addiction management from TTK, Chennai and ensure quality of services in the centre.
6. Organized 10 Alcoholic Anonymous (AA) for recovered persons. 133 members were participated. The long term sober were appreciated and given prizes as source of motivation.
7. TTK Chennai, MSJE and District Child Protection Officer were visited the project and given guidance.



### Impact :

The project with its commendable efforts treated 172 cases and ensured sobriety. In addition, the project strengthened its network with line departments and advocated on preventive measure of addiction in the society. Awareness generation and observation of vital events enriched knowledge on ill-effect of addiction in the community and captured community participation over the programme on rendering quality services to the addicts.

## “GANDHIJI’ –Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts

### Goal :

Ensure sobriety among addicts of Karaikal and neighboring district through medical and psychological treatment.

### Objectives :

- To increase the number of services rendered to alcoholic cases by 20% in one year.
- To continuously assist recovered cases so that cases of relapse is reduced by 10%.
- To organize the awareness programme on handling alcoholic cases for Government officials, private practitioners, Educational institutions and NGO’s
- To network with the related departments and CBO’s to strengthen the services to the entire district.

### Activities :

1. The project felt proud for providing medical and psychological treatment to 179 clients and out of that 155 were leading a drug free life.
2. 1968 individual counseling, 262 group therapies, 51 family therapies, 144 yoga & meditations and daily re-educative classes helped the addicts to recover from addictive behaviour.
3. Besides indoor treatment services, the project organized 45 awareness programmes on ill-effects of addiction, functions of IRCA and thereby 2055 were participated and got sensitized.

4. 240 home visits and 347 regular follow up counseling sessions were conducted and re-ensured sobriety of 140 cases.
5. 18 Alcoholic Anonymous (AA) meet ings were conducted and 358 sober patients were participated. AA members from Trichy and Mayiladuthurai hailed to the meeting and shared their peace and joyfulness of drug free life and motivated the members to remain sober.
6. As per the guidelines of the District administration, the project followed preventive measures of COVID-19 in the campus and sensitized the clients on hygiene practices.
7. International Day Against Illicit Trafficking and Drug abuse was organized on 26th June under the chairmanship of the District Sub-Collector, Karaikal on 26th June. The sober along with family members participated and shared their postive life style attained after treatment from Gandhiji – IRCA programme.
8. Students from Immaculate, Arignar Anna Govt. Arts and Science College and Institute were hailed to the centre for training and field work and understand addiction issues and its management techniques.
9. During reporting period, TTK (RRTC) chennai and MSJE visited the project and given guidance.



### Impact :

The project successfully treated 179 out of that 155 are leading drug free life. Continuous home visit and follow up strengthen the relationship between project and the clients to remain sober for longer period. The community awareness events and support from allied department paved way on extending quality services to the addicts in Karaikal district.

## A Project under Circular Economy Solutions (CES) Preventing Marine Litter in Ecosystems, Tamilnadu

### Goal :

Promote campaign activities of Circular Economy Solutions (CES) focused on prevention of Marine Litter in Ecosystems" through conducting preiminary assessment and awareness campaign activities in Chennai.

### Objectives :

- To conduct awareness campaign and workshops to reduce, reuse and/or recycle plastic waste, jointly with consumers, producers and recyclers and to establish awareness/outreach campaign to ensure maximum public and private support
- To build capacities/skills of the concerned stakeholders on the issues with plastic waste and the means and methods that can be deployed for preventing it to enter in riverine/ marine ecosystems.

## Activities :

1. With the support of GIZ jointly with MoEFCC, Avvai village welfare society under the campaign activity of “Circular Economy Solutions (CES) focused on prevention of Marine Litter in Ecosystems” through conducting preliminary assessment and awareness campaign activities in Chennai. The awareness campaign activities ensured wider public/private participation as an attempt in reducing the use of plastics and preventing its improper disposal from project sites leading to prevention of riverine and marine litter.
2. Conducted a preliminary assessment through informal group discussion, interview and interaction with various stakeholders in three hotspots of chennai city namely Koyambedu Market, Bus terminus and Pattinapakkam and presented to Tmt. Supriya Sahu, IAS., Principal Secretary, Environment, Climate Change and Forest Department. The Principal Secretary had shown good interest and immediately called the officials to focus on the gap observed. Following to that, the project had met Dr. Manish S Narnaware, IAS., Deputy Commissioner (Health), Greater Chennai Corporation, Mrs. S. Shanthi, CAO/DRO of Market Management Committee, CMDA Chennai and Mr. Srinivasa Roa., Estate Officer, Koyambedu Bus Terminus and planned the awarness campaign activities.
3. “Meendum Manjapai”, a people’s campaign against plastic pollution was launched by the Hon’ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu on 23rd December, 2021 at Kalaivanar Arangam, Chepauk, Chennai. From the project, 15 members from Koyambedu wholesale Seller Association were participated and received the Manjapai.
4. In order to create awareness on ill-effects of Single Use Plastics and to initiate common decision among Koyambedu flower market vendors, GIZ India and Avvai village welfare society organized an Awareness Campaign on Plastic Waste Management in Koyambedu Flower Market Association. Mrs. S. Shanthi, CAO/DRO of Market Management Committee, CMDA Chennai presided. Mr. S. Rondiyam, Leader, Mr.P. Natarajan, Secretary, Mr. K.Perumal, Treasurer of Koyambedu Flower Market Association and 56 Flower Market Vendors were participated. The awareness focused on behaviour change. Various IEC (pictoairal charts) were displayed and educated the flower vendors quoting various examples, case stories and awareness song and distributed cloth bags to all vendors.
5. Organized an awareness event on plastic waste management for Women Self Help Group members and street beautifiers. 70 women Self Help Group (SHG) and 40 street beautifiers were participated. The programme sensitized on ill-effects of single use plastics and the method of segregation at household level. At the end, the SHG members and street beautifiers were taken oath and the project supported each member with cloth bag (Manjai pai).





6. The project has organized an awareness event on plastic waste management to Boys and Girls football Club members thereby 30 boys and 30 girls were participated. Various pictorial charts were utilized and sensitized. Mr. Nirmal the local youth leader presided the event. The participants were supported with T-shirts with a message "Say No to Plastic". At the end, the participants took oath to stop SUP and to use Cloth bag.
7. At Chennai Mofussil Bus Terminal, a signature campaign on usage of cloth bag was organized. The Superident of CMBT Mr. Edwin and Inspector of Police Mr. Gunasekaran signed and started this movement. The education banners were affixed around the waiting hall of the CNBT. More than 1000 passengers viewed the education banners. Nearly 450 to 500 passengers were participated and signed on banner. All those who have signed, received Manja Pai cap as a token of appreciation and initiation to avoid SUP.

### Impact :

Though it is a short term project, the awareness campaign activities were enlighten on inputs pertaining to major issues such as - improper plastic disposal, created awareness on how to reduce, reuse and/or recycle plastic waste, built capacities on means and methods deployed in the region for enhancing the segregation and collection which eventually reduce littering of plastics in riverine marine ecosystems. Moreover the project has promoted good network with Government officials and like minded institutions on addressing plastic waste management.

## Women Empowerment Project :

### Goal :

Sustainable solution to the community around health issues by providing knowledge, changing attitude and promoting practices towards better healthy behaviour

### Objectives :

- To promote women and adolescent groups in each village
- To bring health seeking behavior in the targeted community through BCC activities
- To sensitize women and adolescent girls on menstrual hygiene management, RTI/STI, cervical and breast cancer and Nutrition & Anemia prevention
- To link with health sector and to do referral services for better treatment

### Activities :

1. The project Baseline assessment was done in 05 project villages namely Thethi, Sellur, Palaiyur, Agarakonthai and Kothamangalam of Nagapattinam District and updated in M2i App. The first draft report was submitted to Welspun for further support and feedback.
2. Organized 05 stakeholders meeting in 05 project villages and thereby 75 were participated. The meeting focused on village level support for the programme, significance of Nutrition & Anemia and leveraging support for the deserved.



3. Street theatre event was organized in 05 project villages and covered 1299 people. The street theatre focused on causes of anemia, intake of iron rich foods, casues of anemia, importance of nutrition for adolescent girls and women, govt schems such as IFA supplements, ICDS services, what is hemoglobin level and why is important, Preventive measures etc..
4. The Flip Book and calendor type of IEC were prepared in all 04 thematic areas such as Menstrual Hygiene Management, Nutrition & Anemia, Cervical & Breast cancer and RTI & STI. The awareness materials were given to each Outreach worker and trained them on its use. The Flip book will be utilized during Home visit to educate the participants.
5. 2500 Anemia pre test was done for women and adolescent girls. During Behaviour Change Communication (BCC) sessions, the staff engaged in Anemia pre test in all 05 villages. The pre test status was uploaded in M2i App then and there.
6. The project had promoted 100 groups and sensitized all 100 women and adolescent groups on Nutrition and Anemia. As a result of this BCC sessions, 2492 members were benefited. The BCC sessions was very useful to the participants and they shared that most of the nutritious items like egg and vegetables were sold outside for money whereas they have not thought off its nutrition value. After this session, they plan to focus on intake of nutritious items to lead a healthy life.
7. Organized three free medical camps at Thethi, Agarakonthai and Sellur villages and totally 563were benefited. 20 Doctors and nurses from Vinayaga Mission, Karaikal hailed and given treatment. Major health realted problems identified in the medical camp were Hypertension, Thyroid, Joint pain, diabetics, Phenomina, worm infection and common cold. The respective Panchayat did auto awareness prior to the medical camp in all streets and extended support.
8. On 23rd Feb 2022, the Welspun CSR Head Mrs. Shilpa visited the project in Nagapattinam. She was participated in BCC sessions held in Palaiyur, Kothamangalam and Agarakonthai village on Nutrition and anemia and interacted with participants. She motivated the staff team and also appreciated the efforts of community mobilization. She also suggested to focuses on leveraging govt. support for deserved and value addition on livelihood in future.



### Impact :

The project created a ray of hope among women and adolescent girls by creating awareness on nutrition & anemia and in continuation to that plans to sensitize on other key thematic areas such as RTI/STI, cervical & breast cancer and menstrual hygiene management. The project feel satisfied for covering 2500 women and adolescent groups in all 5 villages to share and learn training inputs with other members in the community.

## Dettol School Hygiene Education Programme:

### Goal :

Promote hygiene education among school children to bring positive behaviour change on hygiene practices and awareness building among teachers and community in Tamilnadu and Puducherry State.

### Objectives :

- Continuation of the current and new interventions to existing target group with necessary reinforcement and reorientation as per requirement in the three states
- Introduce and pilot new ideas and innovations through design thinking – Looking beyond hand Hygiene, clean toilets and safe drinking water
- Expand and replicate the successful interventions in new geographies within the three existing states and add more states
- Going to scale in three states through e learning and media campaign with special emphasis on Covid – 19 protocols and vaccination

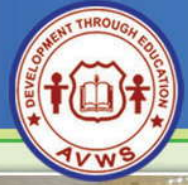
### Activities :

1. COVID vaccination Awareness programmes were organized in rural villages and sensitized the general public with IEC materails especially women on importance of COVID vaccination and thereby reached 6825 people.
2. Orientation on e-learning of Hygiene Education was held for NGOs working in Tamilnadu and thereby 72 NGOs were participated and benefited.
3. World Handwashing Day and World Toilet Day were organized in schools by covering teachers and PTA membes and therbey 5065 students were got sensitized.
4. Trained 611 school teachers of Tamilnadu and 536 school teachers of Puducherry on Hygiene Education through powerpoint, role play and demonstration method. The District Collector, Karaikal, District Administrative Officer of Mahe & Yanam, State Project Director, Deputy Director, Chief Educational Officer of Puducherry were presided.
5. Ensured patcipation of 1077 children in Online competition such as Slogan, Poster making and Rangoli all over Tamilnadu and Puducherry by having association with Hindu Young World and motivated the studnets with prizes.
6. Dettol School Hygiene Education Programme was launched by the Honourable Education Minister in Tamilnadu and inaugurated Hygiene corner promoted in Govt. Higher Secondary School, Chennai.





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7. Honourable Lt. Governor and Honourable Chief Minister, Puducherry were launched the Dettol School Hygiene Education programme in Puducherry and released 33 online videos on Hygiene Education.
8. Medical Star Award was organized in Chennai, Coimbatore and Puducherry in association with Hindu Tamizh Thisai and Collective Good Foundation and thereby 197 doctors were selected and awarded.
9. The trained schools were supported with Hygiene Buddy – a tool kit to educate students on hygiene education to 662 schools.
10. Selected 20 schools to promote Pro type hygiene corner in Tamilnadu and Puducherry and Supported 78 schools to apply for Swachh Vidyalaya Award. 33 online videos were supported to all trained schools and promoted 08 whatsapp groups with membership of 899 teachers to follow and guide them appropriately.



## Wash School and Green Temple in Tamil Nadu:

### Goal :

Promotion of WASH facilities in 30 schools and convert 30 % of HR&ED temples as Green temple to zero waste temples within March 2024.

### Objectives :

- Promotion of WASH facilities in 30 schools along with hygiene education
- Converting 30 % of HR&ED temples as Green temple having zero waste and having skill on better waste management in 12 districts of Tamilnadu
- Ensuring all wash facilities for the promotion of hygiene standard to create best learning environment in schools
- Promoting Green temple committees in all temples to monitor temple cleanness and waste management activities.

### Activities :

1. Met Deputy Commissioner of Greater Chennai Corporation (GCC) and obtained permission for the repair and renovation work in 09 schools and 09 Anganwadi centers.
2. Project orientation meeting was held for staff team explaining about the goal, objectives and activities of ITVC mission Sunerha Kal programme.

3. At first phase, 09 schools and 09 Anganwadies were selected and done baseline assessment on WASH facilities.
4. Promoted Child Cabinet in 09 schools with 10-20 members each and oriented on their roles and responsibilities and facilitated towards good performance.
5. The staff team went for an Exposure visit to WASH institute at Viarlaimalai of Pudhukottai District and learnt about ITC activities already in place on WASH components. The staff team also visited the repair and renovation work in Anganwadies and Schools and interacted with Children Cabinet.
6. Approached the District Joint commissioners of HR&ED temples namely Mayiladuthurai, Nagapattinam, Thiruvarur, vellur, Salem and Thiruvannamalai and explained about the project activities and built rapport.
7. Inaugurated pooja of repair and renovation work in Anganwadi centre of Ambedkar nagar, Ramanathapuram District. The ward councillor and from ITC Mr. Sugandhan were present.
8. Mother Committee was organized at ICDS centre of Ambedkar nagar, Ramanathapuram District and sensitized on their roles and responsibilities to monitor the repair and renovation work. Totally 27 members were participated and got sensitized.
9. Baseline assessment in 20 temples on waste management is in progress. Meantime, the staff team met the Executive Officers, Inspectors and Temple gurukul to know the status of Bio waste in the temples.



### Impact :

The Project started in Feb 2022 and in first phase, it has done its baseline and foundation work on executing WASH and Green temples in Tamilnadu. The ITC Mission Sunerha Kal is not just a program it aims to assure a good WASH facility for the younger generation and also for better waste management in temples. Coming years the project hope it would bring tangible results..

AS part of the Dettol Banega Swasth India (DBSI) campaign, Avvai Village Welfare Society with the support of Collective Good Foundation is planning to train primary and middle schools teachers.

The programme is aimed at training 186 teachers from 93 primary & middle schools. Collector Arjun Sharma inaugurated a four-day training program on Monday. He advised the teachers to practice hygiene and educate the children with activity-based learning. He also thanked DBSI for taking up hygiene education to children which, he said, was the need of the hour.

Deputy Director of School Education Rajeshwari, Additional District Programme Coordinator Sheela, Avvai Village Welfare Society Secretary M Krishnakumar and zonal supervisors participated and motivated the teachers on promoting hygiene education in schools.

The non-profits are training the teachers on hygiene education, including personal hygiene, hygiene at home, at school, during illness and hygiene in the environment. They are also planning to support teachers' curriculum manuals, student workbooks, non-touch hand wash dispensers, cartoon-based videos on hygiene and Hygiene Buddy, and a science-based tool kit to learn about safe hygiene.

Since schools are closed due to the pandemic, the programme would be telecast on YouTube and shared in WhatsApp.
