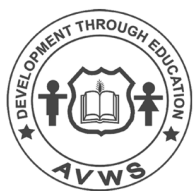

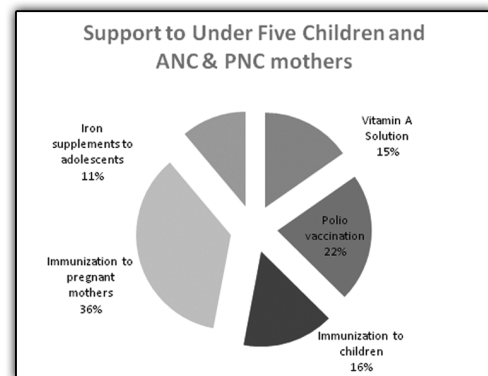
Organization Profile

AVVAI VILLAGE WELFARE SOCIETY shortly known as "Avvai" was initiated on 6th February 1978. It works among children, women, elders and disaster affected in the sectors of education, child rights & child protection, preprimary education, health, women empowerment, de-addiction, elder care, micro insurance, disaster risk management, watershed and climate change adaptation. The organization was registered under Indian Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 in the year 1978. It works in Nagapattinam & Thiruvarur Districts of Tamil Nadu and Karaikal & Puducherry region of Puducherry UT.

PRE - PRIMARY EDUCATION :

1. The Crèche Programme prepares the children for formal school education. The units are differentiated age-wise and the activities conducted following a carefully worked out lesson plan. Flash cards, charts and posters, toys, puzzles and sports/games materials developed by our crèche workers teach children about their environment, colours, nature and hygiene.
2. Avvai has reached 456 underprivileged children this year through 15 creche centers at Nagapattinam. The creche centers are located in rural remote villages having poor access to Govt. ICDS centre.
3. Out of 456 children, 212 are boys and 244 are girls. 188 children (106 Girls and 82 Boys) who crossed age of 5 enrolled at nearby Schools to continue their primary education.
4. Crèche workers are responsible for ensuring that the children are enrolled into local government schools once they reach the eligible age.
5. The children are educated sports and games, moral stories, basic activity based learning and hygiene practice. The syllabus prepared during periodical staff meeting was utilized to educate the children.
6. Medical support extended with the support of local Village Health Nurse. 1050 pregnant women and 456 children got vaccinated and 448 received Vitamin A solution. 326 adolescent girls have received Iron supplements and napkins in 15 project villages. 646 children got polio vaccination.
7. Parents meetings are regularly held to keep parents involved and informed about matters such as school admissions, vocational training, celebrations of festivals, prevention of diseases, health, hygiene and cleanliness. Such awareness programmes held for parents of crèche children allows crèche workers to keep in touch with the community and its needs.
8. Organized 176 Parents meetings and thereby 2920 members were participated. The meeting focused on registration of birth and death certificate, usage of toilets, promotion of kitchen garden, participating in free medical camp and Balwadi management.
9. Organized various meetings and functions on social events like Independence Day, Republic Day, Anganwadi Day, Annual Day in the creche centre and thereby 3375 were participated.
10. As an outreach programme, the Balwadi care takers have leveraged Rs.180000/- under Pudhuvazhvu Thittam for livelihood enhancement activities to SHGs with the members of physically challenged and Rs.1380000/- was leveraged to marginalized SHGs in rural settings. Besides that the care taker assisted on getting Old Age Pension for 16 elders and supported to obtain NREGA card to 64 families.
11. The caretaker assisted on selecting 84 youths and adolescents to join in vocational training course such as welding, tailoring, driving and computer organized by the Govt under livelihood project.



NAGAPATTINAM CHILDLINE 1098 :

Nagapattinam Childline 1098 is the City Model works in 36 wards of Nagapattinam area. However, the project addresses child right issues in the entire district with the support of allied departments. In Nagapattinam, the Project Childline 1098 commenced its service aftermath of Tsunami on 5th January 2005. Since its inception, different kinds of child right violation issues were addressed like child labour, child marriages, child trafficking, missing children, sexually & physically abused children with the support o allied system.



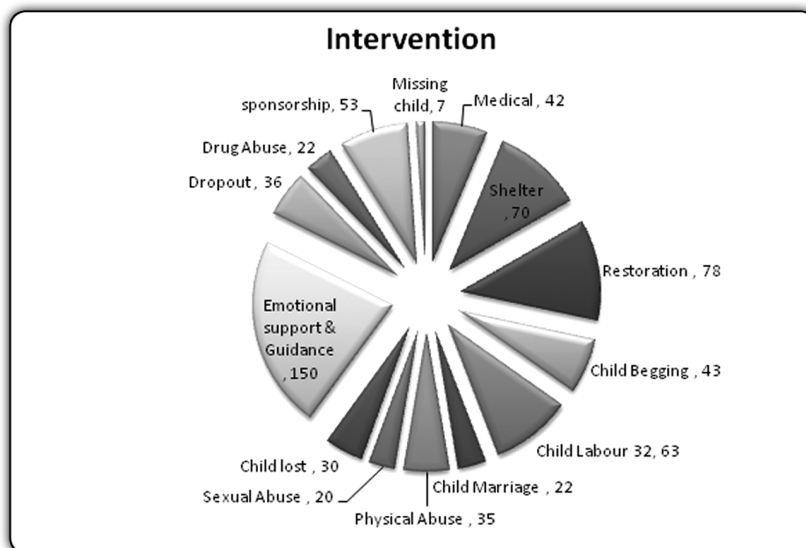
The children in need of care and protection who are rescued by the Childline 1098 are produced before Child Welfare Committee (CWC) formed as per Juvenile Justice Care and Protection Act 2000 for shelter, restoration, education and other necessary support for the children.

1. During this reporting period, the project Nagapattinam Childline 1098 has received 2153 calls and out of that 671 were intervention calls. The children rescued were given care and protection and restored with parents. Those children without parental care are produced before Child Welfare Committee and children in need of education and other supports are rendered with the support of Govt and allied departments.
 - Awareness and outreach activities were conducted for school children, self help groups, anganwadi workers, auto and van stand drivers, youth groups, fisherfolk, daily wage labourers, agriculture workers, sanitation workers and general public. The awareness and outreach activities focused on toll free number 1098 and its function. Moreover, special attention focused on child sexual abuse and child marriage and thereby the Komal video was telecasted at schools and villages.

2. Sensitized 7902 school children by covering 66 schools at this reporting period. The children are educated on child helpline services and child protection mechanism.
3. The Komal video on prevention of Child Sexual Abuse was telecasted at Childline Advisory Board Meeting and as per the direction of the District Collector, it was telecasted at schools and enriched awareness among students.
4. Considering World Day for Prevention of Child Abuse, signature campaign was organized. A vehicle was decorated with awareness posters and with signature banners and moved around Nagapattinam New & Old Bus Stand, Auto stand, College, School, Railway station, Hospital and sensitized the public about the Day, got their signature to act against child abuse and also collected their opinion to stop child abuse.

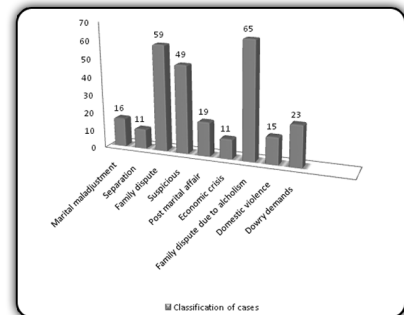
- Assisted Operation Muscon Team on rescuing 45 begging children at Velankanni and thereby 09 children were enrolled in Bridge school and others were restored with parents after getting written statement. The remaining children were very young and they did begging along with her relatives and parents. In the process of operation muscon, DCPU, CWC, AWPS, Anti Human Trafficking, Labour Department and Childline were involved. The operation carried out from 1st July 2015 to 31st July 2015 at Nagapattinam.
- Mass awareness programme was conducted at Velankanni considering Velankanni festival from 29th August 2015 to 8th September 2015. During outreach activities in tourist spot, 20 boys and 11 girls were reunited with parents by using information & announcement centre. The children left their parents unknowingly because of crowd during festival.
- The Nodal organization has organized a meeting to collab staff team on preparing tool kit on child protection on 6th August 2015. All collab staff team were participated and prepared a tool kit on child marriage, child trafficking, child abuse and 4 basic principles of UNCRC. The charts are used for the awareness and outreach activities to educate the children and the general public at large.



- 02 City Advisory Board (CAB) meeting was organized under the chairmanship of the District Collector, Nagapattinam and thereby 68 district officials were participated and thereby continuously extending their cooperation to the project on rescue and intervention process.
- 46 staff review meetings were conducted and thereby detailed action plans were derived and effective intervention strategies were framed and dealt child protection issues.
- Celebrated Se Dosti Events along with children by tying Raksha Bandhan to District Officials and line Departments. Besides that the issues raised during Open House events were consolidated and submitted as 10 demands to the officials .
- Nagapattinam Childline 1098 project was visited by Mr. Manoj Joseph, Senior Programme Coordinator from SRRC on 23rd September 2015. The staff team was oriented on Child sexual abuse and with basic child rights laws. Mr. Manoj, congratulated the team for the good work and the understanding level on addressing child right violation issues in the district. He also thanked the team for adopting intervention protocol on addressing the issue.

“VIDIYAL” - FAMILY COUNSELING CENTRE :

1. The Family Counselling Centre programme supported 268 women in distress this year and out of that 240 were rehabilitated successfully. Out of 240, 11 were admitted in Short Stay Home, 8 got separated and 11 were received treatment from de-addiction centre and 210 were united with parents after counselling.
2. Conducted 48 village level awareness meetings on women rights, ill-effects of early marriage, sexual violence and preventive measures and thereby 840 general public were sensitized.
3. Through outreach activities, the programme reached to the panchayat president, ward members, councillors, district officials, Association members, SHGs, adolescent girls, anganwadi workers and NGO working on women rights.
4. The counsellors attend periodical meetings conducted at All women police station, collectorate and mobile counselling and address the cases with technical support.
5. Conducted 102 follow up and 126 home visit and ensured welfare of cases rehabilitated through family counseling center.
6. Organized 04 subcommittee meeting and thereby 8 clients were rehabilitated with support of committee members of which all 8 clients were joined with spouse.
7. The counsellors took part in the training programme organized by the Tamil nadu State Social Welfare Board on counseling techniques and updated their skills and knowledge on address women issues.



“ADAIKALAM” - SHORT STAY HOME FOR WOMEN :

1. At this reporting period, the Short Stay Home for the distress women has taken care of 50 inmates and 20 children who come out of difficult circumstances. 20 inmates were newly admitted and 20 women and 16 children were discharged. At present, 30 women and 4 children are taken care at Home.
2. Out of 20 discharged cases, 11 were restored with spouse and 09 with parents. 42 inmates were trained on vocational trades such as tailoring, Basket making, Embroidering, Paper cover making and Jewel making.
3. Through this project, the community members were sensitized on women rights and related issues by conducting several awareness programme and thereby at this period, 42 programmes were conducted and 952 members were participated. The programme focused on women rights, legal provisions, domestic violence act, dowry act, early marriage prevention, women helpline etc.
4. 4 Home committee meetings were organized and discussed on rehabilitation of clients who were staying more than 6 months and in addition the committee focused on quality of services and legal support for the clients.
5. The inmates at Home are supported with food, clothing, medical facilities and recreation at free of cost. Moreover, vocational trainings were conducted for the clients on paper cover making, basket making, tailoring etc as part of rehabilitation.
6. 38 Home visits and 46 follow ups were carried out and assisted clients for successful rehabilitation.
7. The Joint Secretary from TNSWB, the District Social Welfare Officer, Nagapattinam and the District Supply Officer have visited the Home several times, interacted with clients about the services, verified the documents and given guidance.

“MARUMALARCHI” SWADHAR HOME :

1. A Swadhar Home supported by Department of Women and Child Development is functioning at Sirkazhi aiming to provide primary need of shelter, food, clothing and care to the marginalized women/girls living in difficult circumstances who are without any social and economic support. The inmates are rehabilitated socially and economically through education, awareness, skill up gradation and personality development through behavioral training etc.
2. At this year, 68 women and 11 children in difficult circumstances such as destitute widows, women without family support, trafficked women/girls rescued from brothels or other places or victims of sexual crime were taken care by providing food, shelter, clothing, counseling services and social mainstreaming. At this reporting period, 14 inmates were admitted newly and 16 inmates were reunited with their parents and spouse through counselling support. At present, 52 inmates are taken care at Home.
3. Conducted 282 individual counseling sessions, 60 group therapies , 45 home visits and 68 follow –ups. Organized 38 community awareness programmes and 854 members were participated. Vocational trainings were provided to inmates on tailoring, embroidering, basket making with bamboo, cover making and flower garland.
4. The project has taken care of 68 inmates under distress and reunited 16 deserted inmates with their family members through counseling process and made them self-employed by providing vocational skill. In addition, the Project sensitized on women rights and promoted healthy relationship with line departments on addressing women under difficult circumstances.

DEEN DAYAL UPADHYAYA GRAMEEN KAUSHALYA YOJANA (DDU-GKY) - SKILL DEVELOPMENT FOR INCLUSIVE GROWTH:

1. The Ministry of Rural Development implements DDU-GKY to drive this national agenda for inclusive growth, by developing skills and productive capacity of the rural youth from poor families. As part of the project, Avvai village welfare society has been selected as Project implementing agency and thereby it works in Semmanarkoil, Sirkazhi and Kollidam Blocks of Nagapattinam District. Avvai has been approved as Program Implementing agency to upgrade the skill of Youths in Nagapattinam District for 750 youths.



2. At this year, 150 youths from poor families were identified for skill training and out of that 139 youths were trained on different trades and 11 got dropout due to multiple reasons.
3. Through a vocational training centre, 56 youths were trained in Fabrication –Welding, 28 youths were trained in Basic Housing Electrical work and 55 youths were trained in Driving and Automobile.
4. Out of 55 youths who were trained on automobile, 32 were got placement and earning Rs.15000/- per month and rest of the trained youths will be placed in the coming months.
5. Considering successful implementation of the project, the District Administration has appreciated the organization with Award in the year 2016.
6. For the year 2016-17, Avvai has planned to train 150 youths in computer, beautician, nursing assistant, welding and driving.

LIVELIHOOD ENHANCEMENT PROGRAMME :

Under Livelihood Enhancement Programme, Avvai village welfare society has assisted 123 SHGs with Rs.217 lakhs towards Income Generation Activities especially on agriculture developmental activities by promoting bank linkages. Out of Rs.217 lakhs loan disbursement amount, Rs.96.5 lakhs was repaid. Nearly 75 % of loan has been given to women belongs to marginalized communities.

115 women were trained on Disaster Risk Reduction in coordination with Madras Institute of Social studies in Sembanarkoil Block. The women learnt adaptation and mitigation measure of DRR.

Organized meetings and trainings on group dynamics, credit management and book keeping and thereby the SHGs have gained confidence over group administration.

KAKKALANI WATERSHED DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME :

1. Kakkalani Watershed Development Project is supported by NABARD and it is implemented in Kakkalani, Serunallur, Koothur, Eluppur and Pattamangalam villages of Kilvelur Block, Nagapattinam District. The project aims for overall development of families through integrated activities like livestock development, horticulture, plantation, women's development and providing improved livelihood options to the landless families.



- At this year, Avvai has developed horticulture and forestry in 80 acres of waste land by demolishing the thorn pushes and made it productive in the operational villages.
- 5947 saplings (forestry) and 14224 horticulture plants such as guava, mango, Sappotta and promogranite were disbursed and 172 acres brought under cultivation.
- Constructed 18 Farm ponds by enriching knowledge on water shed & water harvesting among farmers and ensured water conservation in the operational villages for sustainable agriculture.
- 82 farmers were trained on organic cultivation and got benefited.
- As a result of water conservation, the farmers started cultivating local traditional variety of paddy like seeraga samba Kudhirai valli and pleased of its production.



“ANUBHAVAM” HOME FOR SENIOR CITIZEN- KILVELUR :

1. At this year the Home for the elderly taken care of 43 vulnerable and neglected elders. (17 male and 26 female).

At this reporting period, 3 elders (1 male and 2 female) were newly admitted and 03 of them were reunited with their families.

2. Besides medical camps, the local VHN does monthly medical check up to the elders and provides nutrition supplement and treat illness for the needy elders.



3. 26 elders voluntarily came forward and learning yoga taught in the Home every day. The active elders at Home are maintaining a garden and watering the plants as part of recreation. More than that, reading newspaper, watching television, knitting mat, basket and hand-fans are entertained for the elders.

4. Diwali, Pongal, Independence & Republic Day, Karthigai deepam, Ayuthapooja and other local festivals were celebrated with elders by organizing different cultural programmes & events. The donors, well wishes, college students, women self help groups, government officials and NGO staffs were participated and enjoyed the Day along with elders.

The project leveraged material donations like household materials, cable charges, clothes, cot, tube lights, motor, charger light, trunk box and entertainment items for the project. The kind hearted donors were thanked in person and through letter communication.

1. At this reporting period, the District Collector, Thasildar, Block Development Officer, Revenue Inspector, Fire Service officer, District Social Welfare Officer, Taluk Supply Officer, Extension Officer, Union Chairman of Kilvelur Block, RRTC and Doctor from Primary Health Centre were visited the Home several times and given their guidance and suggestions.



“AMBUJAM” HOME FOR SENIOR CITIZEN: SAMANTHANPETTAI

1. During the reporting period, the project Ambujam Home for Senior Citizen has taken care of 25 vulnerable elders and given homely atmosphere. (Male 12 & Female 13). 10 Elders were newly admitted to the Home and 7 Elders were reunited with their families successfully and 3 of them were expired due to old age.

2. The project organized periodical get-together meetings for elders by inviting local resource persons and oriented on legal rights, personal hygiene, nutrition, spirituality, interpersonal relationship and importance of Meditation.



3. Elders Day was organized in coordination with school children and there were cultural shows and health interaction with children and elders.

4. Medical camp was organized in collaboration with local Hospital and Clinics. Eye check-ups and Blood test were done for elders and supported with free medicine for sugar and blood pressure. One elder got his vision back, another elder able to hear properly with the use of hearing machine and four elders got walking sticks.
5. The elders at Home are engaged in gardening, book binding, art & paintings, drawing rangoli, cultural and other recreational activities. The project was visited by the District Collector, District Revenue Officer, Social Welfare Officer and Extension officer and given their guidance. Moreover, the Project has celebrated importance Days and Events like Pongal & Diwali, Independence Day and Republic Day along with elders and enjoyed by sharing sweets.
6. The project mobilized material donations like clothes, groceries, walking stick, western toilet and recreational items from the community and like minded institutions. The Project satisfied of its services to the vulnerable elders of providing food, shelter, medical support, meditation and recreation.



MULTISERVICE CENTRE FOR SENIOR CITIZEN :

1. With the support of Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Avvai has extending its support to vulnerable elders through running Multiservice Centre for the Aged at Palaiyanur Melpathi, Puliur of Nagapattinam district.
2. The project extended lovable Day Care Facilities to 52 vulnerable elders (Male 19, Female 33). 52 elders are given Day Care facilities in a friendly atmosphere with food, shelter and refreshment.
3. Medical support and yoga classes are conducted for the beneficiaries and moreover functions such as Dewali, Pongal, Independence Day, elders day and Republic Day were celebrated with community participation.
4. The project was mobilized as material donations such as food, clothes, entertainments, vessels etc from the community. Elders at Home enjoy the benefits of reading newspaper, watching Television, making paper cover and group singing.
5. At this reporting period, the District Social Welfare Officer and Extension Officer, Nagapattinam and RRTC have visited the project and given guidance.

“PUTHUMALAR” INTEGRATED REHABILITATION CENTRE FOR ADDICTS: NAGAPATTINAM

1. At this reporting period, the project has admitted 232 cases and provided medical and psychological treatment. Out of 232 cases, 184 cases are leading drug free life.
2. Conducted 2035 Individual Counseling, 301 Group therapies and 48 Family therapies. In Family therapies the counselor makes the family understand that alcoholism is a disease, enable the wife to appropriately express her feelings of shame, anger and hurt, help her develop a supportive attitude towards the alcoholic and help her get back to a functional life style.
3. 221 home visits and 742 follow up were made to prevent relapse. Totally 184 cases were fully recovered at this year. Conducted 48 awareness programme on ill-effect of addiction to various community groups and totally 947 members were benefited.
4. Organized 10 Alcoholic Anonymous (AA) meetings for recovered persons and ensured their sobriety status. Totally 265 members were got benefited.



5. Organized a rally event considering International Day Against Drug Abuse at Nagapattinam. The District Collector, RDO, Deputy Commissioner, Thasildar and officials from Excise were presided and around 500 people were participated in a rally programme and sensitized the public on ill-effect of drugs. The project strengthened its network with various departments & CBOs like Family Counselling Centre, Auto drivers Association, women & men self help groups, NGOs, village panchayats, Alcoholic Anonymous, District administration etc and ensured full-fledged treatment to drug addicts.
6. The project staff underwent capacity building from TTK, Chennai on the topic of Counselling skills and techniques and ensured quality of services in the centre.
7. The probation officer from Department of Social Defence and officials from TTK-RRTC visited the center and given guidance.

“GANDHIJI” INTEGRATED REHABILITATION CENTRE FOR ADDICTS - KARAIKAL:

- The project “Gandhiji” Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts has admitted 165 addicts and out of that 136 cases were leading a drug free life.
- Conducted 1638 individual counseling, 292 group therapy, 48 family therapy, 271 yoga & meditations for drug addicts to make the treatment successful.
- 220 home visits and 569 regular follow up sessions were conducted and ensured sobriety.
- 48 awareness programmes were organized and thereby sensitized 332 NYK youth clubs members, 867 SHG members, 85 school students, 1082 general public on ill-effect of addiction and related issues by using pictorial posters and banners.
- 24 Alcoholic Anonymous (AA) meetings were conducted and AA members from Mayiladuthurai and Kumbakonam were presided the meeting and motivated the sober patients to lead a dignified way of life.
- Observed International Day against Drug Abuse and illicit trafficking along with district administration at Karaikal. The NYK, NSS volunteers, school and college students, District Collector and Additional Director, Social Welfare Department and police were participated and made the Day a grant success. Nearly 1800 members were participated. The general public was sensitized on ill-effect of addiction through handbills and procession.
- The project was visited by the District Social Welfare Officer, Welfare Inspector, Revenue Officer, District Youth Coordinator, NSS Coordinator and RRTC official and given their guidance.



PROJECT ON BUILDING RESILIENCE OF CHILDREN AND THEIR COMMUNITIES BY INTEGRATING DRR, SOCIAL PROTECTION AND TECHNOLOGY :

1. The project aiming to improve access to social protection and increase capacity to reduce disaster risks in two panchayats namely PR Puram & Thirupoondi East comprised of 10 villages in Nagapattinam District of Tamil nadu.
2. Organized a District Level Dissemination and Consultation Findings of Baseline Report at Hotel Sea Horse, Nagapattinam and 47 members were participated. Mrs. Alka Singh, State Programme Manager and Er. Chandan Kumar, Project Coordinator were participated and shared about the finding of the assessment done by the project. Mr. Rajaram, the District Project Manager, Community Based DRM Project, DRDA explained about the EOC and VHF functions. The Joint Director of Health Service, Nagapattinam, Fire Station Officer, Child Welfare Committee Chairperson & Members of Nagapattinam District, Anganwadi workers, Inspector of Anti Human Trafficking Unit, District Coordinator of SSA Department, Officials from DDMA, DMI Director, JJB Member, All Women Police Station Sub Inspector and Press people were also participated and made the programme a grand success.
3. At this reporting period, the community groups promoted by the project in the 1st phase were trained on their roles and responsibilities and thereby the 10 children groups were trained and 170 children were benefited. The children were educated on their rights, important functions and child protection measures.
4. 10 numbers of village level Task Force Committee were promoted and trained on their roles and responsibilities by using demonstration kit of Disaster Management materials. Totally 387 members from early warning, first aid, search and rescue, shelter management and evacuation were benefited.
5. At school level, the project has promoted School Disaster Management Committee and Task Force Committee in 8 schools. The committee members were trained on their roles by conducting demonstration with the support of Fire Service Department. Totally 960 were participated and benefited.
6. Established 2 Panchayat level Disaster Management Resource Centres and 8 School level Disaster Management Resource Centres (DMRC) in 10 project villages. The DMRC are supported with 40' Television, solar panel, UPS, Battery and CPU. The centre remains as resource centre to educate on disaster management at large.
7. Observed National Science Day and Women's Day and thereby 311 were participated and benefited. The programme focused on model school on DRR and role of women on DRR. The activity brought out greater visibility to the project and sensitized the general public at larger level.



8. Developed 3000 numbers of student colouring Hand books on DRR with pictorial representation, Did wall paintings on DRR/CSSP in 2 PDMRC, did visibility board and notice board in 2 PDMRC, prepared district officials contact lists, prepared social, resource and vulnerable map banners for 10 villages.
9. Organised the school DM committee and School Task Force Committee and oriented on purpose of the activity and shared a model plan of safety plan. Totally 426 students and teachers were involved.
10. The colouring hand book on DRR was released by the school headmaster and by the VDMC leader and received by the children. The children found the book more useful and colour ful to do their drawings and to know various information on DRR.
11. The community score card was done in 11 ICDS centre located in the project villages. The community score card brought out several planning measures to improve overall functions of ICDS center.
12. Did FGD with children and teacher on issues of children at school, vulnerabilities faced by children through power walk, interactive session on positive feelings. 240 teachers and students were participated and benefited.
13. Organized Children's Day Programme and thereby 442 children were participated. The children took part in the drawing competition on "My Dream School". The children brought out disaster protection measures like placement of fire extinguisher, compound wall around the school, demolishing damaged water tank and also drawn the facilities needed like library, lab, computer room etc..
14. Mr. Narendra Singh Kachhotiya, Manager-Technology from Save the Children has visited the project and observed the functions of 2 PDMRC and felt satisfied of the services rendered to the public. Mr. Narendra also visited the Thandavamoorthikadu SDMRC and interacted with children on its usage and felt happy.
15. Periodical Staff Review Meetings were organized and entire staffs of the project have participated in the meeting. The meeting focused on reflection of several meetings and trainings organized by SC and Nokia, and planned out various strategies on executing the activities of the project qualitatively in the field.



Catching them Young, Kids Trained to Keep Hands Clean

Nagapattinam: Emphasising the importance of proper handwashing in preventing waterborne diseases responsible for majority of child deaths, a demonstration on proper handwashing method for school children was held in a government primary school near Velankami town on Wednesday. As most of the childhood deaths including due to diarrhoea are caused by pathogenic infections, children in the demonstration were briefed about the importance of maintaining personal hygiene for leading healthy life through pictorial representation.

The demonstration as mooted by UNICEF was held jointly by Save the Children, Nokia, and Avvai Village Welfare Society. About 180 school children of PR Param government primary school near Velankami participated in the demo. The government school children aged between five and 10 years were sensitized about the importance of handwashing. "Diarrhoea is mostly seen as a waterborne disease and the pathogen found in unwashed hands is the pivotal carrier of such deadly yet common diseases. After attending nature's call, including defecation, children should develop a regular habit to wash their hands properly for preventing pathogen from entering human body," R Manivannan, district coordinator of the society, said.

During the demonstration with buckets containing water and soap, the children were briefed about effective washing techniques by using limited quantum of water to wash away pathogens. Stating that children should wash their hands with soap for 20 seconds, including the surface of palms, nails, and between the fingers, organisers informed that excessive usage of water should be avoided. Through pictorial representation, the children were also instructed to spread awareness among neighbours to refrain from defecating in open places.

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

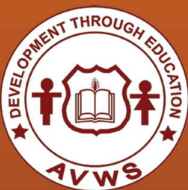
