## Nagapattinam Childline 1098 :

- CHILDLINE 1098 service is a 24 hour free emergency phone outreach service for children in need of care and protection. This is a project supported by the Ministry of Women and Child Development, New Delhi.
- Received 1052 calls out of that 926 were intervention calls. Reached 24490 people and 11110 children through awareness and outreach.
- Stopped 41 child marriages with the support of District Social Welfare Officer, District Child Protection Unit and Police officials.
- 35 school dropouts were rejoined in school.
- 156 children in need of sponsorship and welfare schemes were assisted to file application in concerned departments.
- 230 children were counselled to gain confidence for various issues such as love affair, family dispute and lack of interest on studies.
- 105 children were restored back to family after counselling and support.
- 22 children in need of care and protection were produced before Child Welfare Committee functions at Mayiladuthurai of Nagapattinam District.
- 12 open house meetings were organized and thereby 693 members were participated. Addressed issues pertaining to lack of Anganwadi centre, risky school/ICDS buildings, child marriage, school dropouts, drug abuse and child sexual abuse.
- 28 school awareness programmes were conducted and sensitized 3311 members (Boys: 994 Girls: 2202 and Teachers: 115)
- Besides outreach and awareness, Nagapattinam Childline 1098 organized Child Rights Week and observed National Girl Child Day, International Day against Child Sexual Abuse, Anti-Child Labour Day, International Helpline Day and thereby sensitized 6342 people on its importance and advocated on child rights.
- Participated in the Block & District level Child Protection Committee meeting organized by DCPU and shared the need of support from officials to address children in need of care and protection.
- City Coordinator from Childline India Foundation (CIF) visited the project and given guidance.







## Creche Programme :

- A crèche centre is very important in the life of every child. Avvai village welfare society is running 15 creche centres in Nagapattinam district covering 412 children (Boys:187 and Girls:225). At this reporting period, 122 children (68 Girls and 54 Boys) who crossed age of 5 enrolled at nearby Primary School to continue their primary education.

During this reporting period, 412 children vaccinated against polio and received Vitamin A solutions and were assisted with nutrition support.

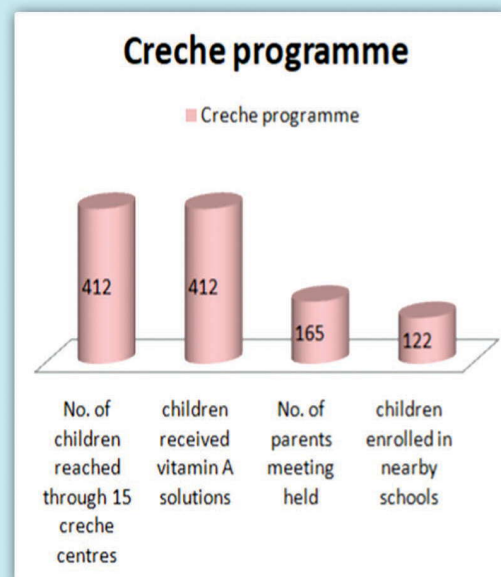
12 meetings were organized for creche teachers and care takers and reviewed their performance 165 parents meetings were held focusing on Children's Day, Independence Day, Republic Day, childhood care and development and crèche management.

Organized periodical Local Committees meetings on crèche management and sought their support for improving the services of crèche programme. Children were educated by using colourful charts, pictures, play materials and numbers.

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The crèche teachers coordinated with Govt. allied department such as Primary Health Centre, school administration, Village Panchayat, Block Development Office on availing their services focusing on early childhood care.

The Project Officer, Child Development Programme Officer from ICDS Dept. inspected the Creche centres and given suggestions.





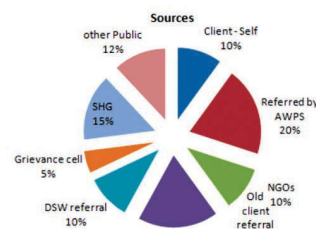


## “Vidiyal” – Family Counselling Centre

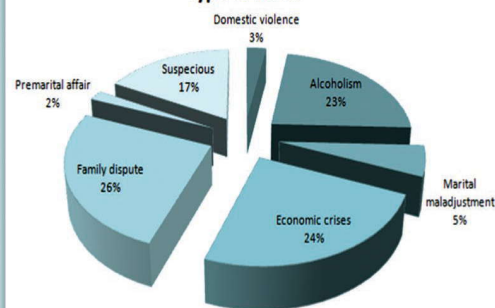
- During this reporting period, the project Vidiyal – Family Counselling Centre counselled 269 cases composed of domestic violence, family dispute, extra marital affairs, suspiciousness, economic crisis, dowry harassment, marital maladjustment and depression.
- 258 cases were rehabilitated successfully with the help of counselling & guidance, support from line departments and networking.
- 807 individual counselling, 558 family counselling, 125 follow up and 240 home visits were undertaken successfully.
- 47 Awareness programmes were held on women rights, Dowry prohibition Act and Domestic violence Act and thereby reached 1892 community members. Posters, notices and case study sharing were adopted to sensitize the people.
- Organized 4 subcommittee meetings under the chairmanship of District Social Welfare Officer and there by 12 clients were rehabilitated successfully.
- The counsellors worked in association with All Women Police Station, Protection Officer, Grievance cell, District Legal Service Authority on addressing issues of women rights.
- The counselors play active role as service providers under section 10(1) of the Protection of Woman from domestic Violence Act, 2005.
- The counsellors were registered in FCC portal of Central Social Welfare Board by online and obtained Registration No.
- The counsellors participated in the exhibition stall organized by Tamil Nadu Social Welfare Board at Chennai and obtained ID card for being counsellors in the programme.
- The Welfare Officer from Tamil Nadu Social Welfare Board and District Social Welfare Officer were visited the project and given guidance.
- The counsellors participated in the training organized by Tamil Nadu Social Welfare Board and extending quality services for the beneficiaries.

Type of cases



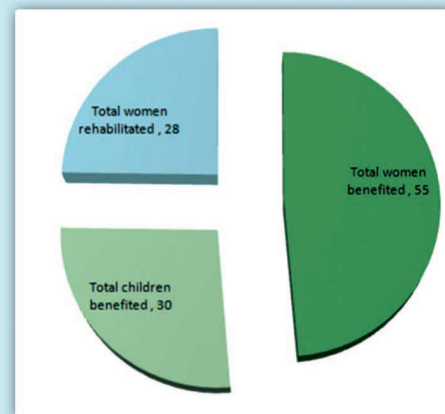




## “Adaikalam” – Swadhar Greh Programme



- During this reporting period, the Adaikalam – Swadhar Greh Programme extended its services to 55 women and 30 children who hailed from difficult circumstances.
- The inmates are provided with shelter, food, medicine, recreation, counselling assistance and rehabilitation at free of cost.
- 31 inmates were newly admitted and 28 inmates were discharged. At present, 27 inmates are taken care at Home. Totally 28 inmates were rehabilitated successfully.
- Besides indoor assistance, the project conducted 34 awareness programmes at community level on women rights and functions of Swadhar Greh and thereby 1658 members were participated.
- The project ensures mainstreaming of inmates by observing home visits and follow up and thereby 62 Home visits and 131 Follow up were done and facilitated for leading a dignified life.
- Organized 04 Home committee meetings and sought departmental support for successful rehabilitation. Conducted 02 medical camps in association with Siddha medicines.
- The women at Swadhar Greh engaged in basket knitting, tailoring and paper cover making to enhance their skill on handicraft work.
- The project was Visited and monitored by the District Collector, District Social Welfare Officer, Nagapattinam & Ariyalur, District Siddha medicine Officer, and visited by Joint Director of Health Services (TB programme) and Taluk Civil Supply Officer.
- Besides the above activities, the project observed Women’s Day, celebrated Diwali, Pongal and other religious festivals in association with line departments and likeminded people.





## “Anubhavam” Home for Senior Citizen :

- Anubhavam Home for Senior Citizens take care deprived, vulnerable and neglected senior citizens by providing with food, shelter, counselling assistance, medical care and recreation. At this reporting period, 10 Senior Citizens were admitted newly (1 male and 9 female). 10 were reunited with their family members successfully. At present there are 40 inmates at Home.
- The project has conducted 34 awareness programme at community level on elder care and thereby 1588 were participated.
- 10 medical camps were conducted and assisted the inmates for Pneumonia vaccination and common ailments. 05 were assisted with spectacles for eye problem. The project extends its gratitude to Apollo, HelpAge India and Govt. Head Quarter hospitals for health related support.
- The project applied for Old Age Pension to 13 senior citizens and out of that 05 got selected from District Administration. Participated in the event of World Elders Day organized by the District Social Welfare Office, Nagapattinam.
- The Project promoted garden in the campus and thereby planted tree saplings.
- Cultural events, get-together, interactive sessions and competitions were conducted as part of important days such as Deepavali, Pongal, Independence Day, Republic Day, Elders’ Day, Karthigai Deepam with Govt and like minded institutions.
- The District collector, Nagapattinam, District Social Welfare Officer, District Revenue Officer, Civil Supply Officer were visited the project and given guidance. Moreover the MSW students from Arignar Anna Govt. Arts and Science College, Karaikal and Central University, Thiruvavur were did field work in the project and interacted with senior citizens and conducting games & competitions.







## “Ambujam” Home for Senior Citizen :

- Ambujam Home for Senior Citizens reached 1809 community members through outreach activities focusing on elder care.
- During this reporting period, the project taken care of 29 senior citizens (7 male and 22 female). Out of that 2 of them are reunited with family members and 2 of them expired due to old age. At present, the Home caters the need of 25 Senior citizens (6 male and 19 female).
- The senior citizens are supported with food, shelter, counselling assistance, medical care and recreation at free of cost. The project supported with Old Age Pension for all 25 elders from District Administration.
- The Senior citizens feel at Home and they are engaged in interested activities such as gardening, hand fan making, paper basket making and other handicraft works. Individual counselling, interactive sessions, yoga, spiritual classes, prayer and recreation activities were conducted.
- 11 medical camps were organized and thereby basic ailments were treated. 09 elders got spectacle for eye problem, 19 were received Pneumonia vaccination. Apollo, Help Age India, local Primary Health Centre Kilvelur and Govt. Head Quarter Hospital were extended health related support to the project.
- Celebrated wedding day for a couple staying in the Home for about 05 years with sweets. The like minded people conveyed their wishes and made it joyful moments.
- World Elders’ Day, Pongal, Diwali, Independence Day, Karthigai deepam, Republic Day were celebrated along with likeminded people by conducting different games and competitions. The students from Arignar Anna Govt. Arts and Science College, Karaikal and Central University, Thiruvavur did their field work and learnt on working with elders. The Social worker Anbumani participated in World Elders Day Organized by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, New Delhi.
- Done Boomi Pooja for reconstruction of Building for Ambujam Home for Senior Citizens in the month of March 2020.
- The Under Secretary and Section Officer from MSJE, New Delhi, District Social Welfare Officer of Nagapattinam and Ariyalur, Executive Officer, Town Panchayat, Block Development Officer, Taluk Civil Supply Officer were visited the project and given suggestions.





### “Annapoorani” Home for Senior Citizen

- The Annapoorani Home for Senior Citizens extended its lovable care and support to 25 senior citizens with food, shelter, counselling assistance, medical care and recreation. Out of that 4 are male and 21 are female. At this reporting period, 18 senior citizens were admitted newly and 21 were discharged. At present, the Home caters the need of 25 senior citizens.
- 06 senior citizens were supported to receive Old Age Pension from District administration. 02 Senior citizens received other supports like hearing aid, walking sticks and spectacles.
- Conducted 4 medical camps and given treatment for common ailments and thereby 22 were benefited.
- World Elders’ Day was observed and thereby competitions, games and prize distribution functions were held. The senior citizens actively participated in cultural programmes and enjoyed.
- Besides providing care and support to senior citizens in the Home, the project reached 879 community members through outreach services focusing on Elder care in the family and community at large.
- The District Social Welfare Officer, GS/MS Extension Officer were visited the project and given guidance.







## Maintenance of Senior Citizens Homes for 50 elderly women :

Avvai village welfare society is implementing a project on Maintenance of Senior Citizens Homes for 50 elderly women in two districts namely Uppliyapuram of Trichirappalli District and Karaikal of Karaikal District.

The project caters the need of 50 elderly women with food, shelter, medical care, recreation, counseling assistance and rehabilitation measures at free of cost. At this reporting period, the two Senior citizens Homes supported 50 elders each who are neglected and deserted by the community. Medical camps were conducted and addressed common ailments. Organized awareness events 12 each on elderly care and sensitized the community. World Elders' Day was observed and thereby competitions, games and prize distribution functions were held. The senior citizens actively participated in cultural programmes and enjoyed.

## Programme for Scheduled Caste :

Avvai village welfare society focuses on improving the lives of scheduled caste by running different schemes. As part of that, Avvai implement Hostel for students of Scheduled caste at Nagapattinam District. 100 girl students are getting benefited out of this Hostel. The Hostel renders food, shelter and recreation facilities at free of cost.

## Programme for Scheduled Tribe :

For improving the lives of scheduled tribe, Avvai village welfare society executes Hostel for 50 girl students, Mobile dispensary and 10-bedded hospital at Trichy district. The schemes address poor and vulnerable tribal community to come up in life and focuses on socio-economic development.



## “Puthumalar” Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts (IRCA)

- Puthumalar – Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts (IRCA) extending medical and psychological treatment to addicts and focusing on whole person recovery. At this reporting period, 186 addicts were admitted and out of that 179 got treated and leading drug free life.



- As part of rehabilitation, the project had given 2148 Individual Counseling, 259 Group therapies, 50 Family therapies and yoga classes for addicts. Moreover the project had done 512 follow up and 240 home visits and ensured sobriety.

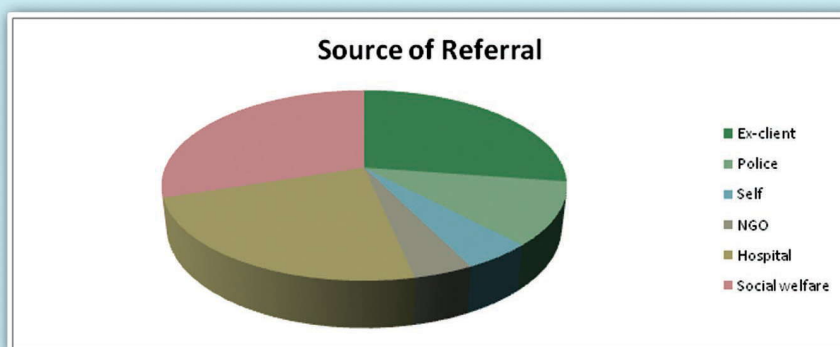
- Besides indoor treatment and rehabilitation, the project has reached 2242 community members through outreach services by conducting 48 awareness programme on ill-effects of addiction to community based organizations.

- The counsellors and Nurse of the project participated in the training programme organized by TTK-Chennai and enriched their capacity on rendering quality services for the addicts.

- Organized Exhibition stall by mobilizing college and NSS students at Andavar Nursing college and sensitized the college students on ill-effects of addiction on the occasion of International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking. Totally 200 students were participated. The role play done by the students were awarded with prize. The officials from District Child Protection Unit, Doctor from Help Age India, Director of Andavar Nursing College and IRCA staffs were presided.

- Organized 11 Alcoholic Anonymous (AA) Meeting for recovered persons and thereby 120 were participated. The addicts under treatment involved in garden activity as part of recreation.

- During this reporting period, the Under Secretary from the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, New Delhi, the District Child Protection Officer (DCPO) of Nagapattinam District and the Probation Officer (Dept. of Social Defence), TTK-Chennai were visited the IRCA programme and given guidance.

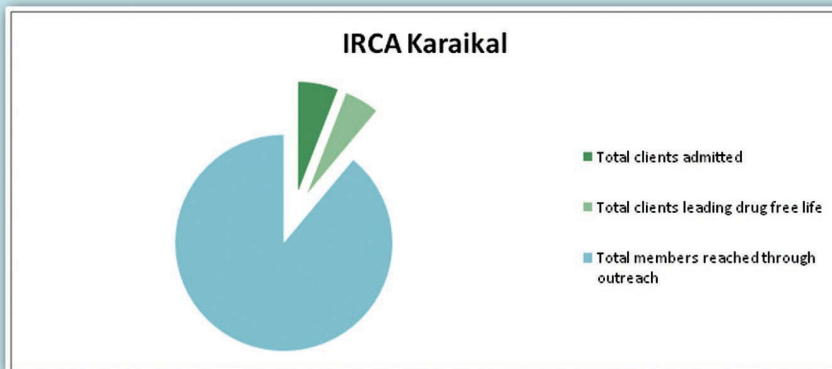






## “Gandhiji” Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts

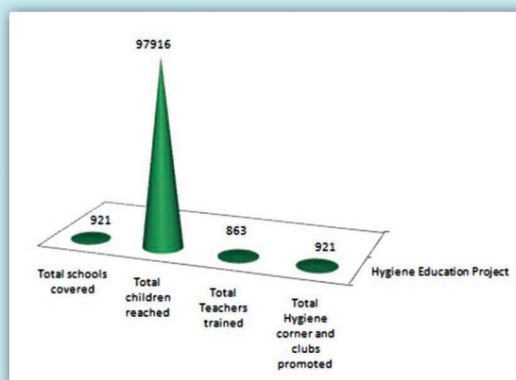
- Gandhiji – Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for addicts (IRCA) had given medical and psychological treatment for 190 addicts and out of that 166 were leading drug free life.
- As part of rehabilitation, 2160 individual counseling, 277 group therapies, 48 family therapies, 217 yoga & meditations were conducted with participation of addicts.
- The project reached 48 community members through awareness and outreach activities and thereby 2855 were benefited. The programme focused on ill-effects of addiction, functions of IRCA, impact of addiction over family, Economic crises etc.
- To ensure sobriety and moral assistance, the project had conducted 271 home visits and 702 follow up. Besides that the project has organized 11 Alcoholic Anonymous (AA) meetings and thereby 205 were participated. The meeting focused on spiritual value, self confidence and joy of being sober.
- The Project organized sensitization programme on ill-effects of addiction to workers of Godrej Consumer Produce Company, Karaikal and thereby 145 were participated.
- The project has organized massive Exhibition Stall by mobilizing college and NSS students and sensitized on ill-effects of addiction to young people. The programme was presided by the District Collector, Karaikal and Assistant Director, Social Welfare Department. Totally 180 were participated and the programme shown the show on educating its importance.
- The counsellors and Nurse undergone training organized by TTK-Chennai and enriched their quality to serve for the addicts. The project was visited by the Education Minister, Crime Branch Inspector, TTK –Chennai, Welfare Inspector, AD social welfare-Karaikal and given guidance.





## Hygiene Education in Primary Schools :

- Under the technical and financial support of Collective Good Foundation (CGF), Avvai Village Welfare Society implement the project in association with Samagra Shiksha in two districts as part of Dettol Banega Swachh India Program with the support of Reckitt Benckiser India Ltd.



- State Project Director of Samagra Shiksha suggested to have a MoU for the program in the state with the implementation partner in order to have a clear role of each partner in the program. Avvai and CGF has facilitated the process in concluding a MoU between SPD SSA and Avvai with clear action points.



- In Thiruvallur District, the project covered 515 schools in 10 Blocks by reaching 64250 school children and in Perambalur District it has covered 406 schools in 04 Blocks by reaching 33666 school children.

- 453 teachers from 473 Schools were trained on Teacher curriculum Manual, Student Work Book, Hand wash methods, usage of Butterfly kit, Play materials and also about the Swachh Vidhyalaya Puraskar Award as refresher training in Thiruvallur District.

- 64250 Student work books were distributed to all the students as per their levels( 1st and 2nd –Level 01, 3rd and 4th –Level 02 and above 5th –Level 03).

- Organized Training of Trainers (ToT) for Block Resource Teachers (BRTes) focusing on Hygiene education programme in Primary schools of Perambalur district. Thiru. Raja, Assistant Project Officer, Samagra Shiksha, Perambalur District & Tmt. Mary meenal, District Education Officer were inaugurated the programme. Totally from all 4 Blocks (Perambalur, Veppanthattai, Veppur and Alanthur) of Perambalur District, 34 BRTes, 8 BEO, 1 APO, 1 DEO, 3 supervisor and 2 District Coordinator were participated.

- The project has organized Teacher training programme in 04 Blocks of Perambalur District 798 teachers were participated from 368 schools. Issued student work book to 33666 children and teachers manual to 3600 teachers.

- Promoted Hygiene clubs and Hygiene corner in 921 schools in both the districts. The students displayed Butterfly kits, hygiene kits, sanitation tools, wall posters, IEC materials and created massive awareness among other children at schools.





- World Handwashing Day 2019 was observed in Veppur and Alathur Blocks of Perambalur District on 15th Oct 2019 at schools. The students participated in a rally programme and sensitized the public on the Day with IEC materials. Totally 150 students took part in rally held at Veppur and 60 students took part in Drawing competition held at Alathur school. Observed World Toilet Day on 19th November 2019 at Kolakanatham Primary school. 111 children and 05 teachers were participated. Officials from Nehru Yuva Kendra and BRTs were presided.
- **Considering World Hand washing Day, the project** organized clean hand shape in 25000 Square feet in Padiyanallur Panachayth Union Middle School in association with PUMS, Attanthangal, PUMS, Mondiyamma Nagar and St.Joseph Middle School. This event was registered in the books of Indiaan World Records and Amazing world records Agencies”.
- World Toilet Day was conducted in 05 Blocks of Thiruvallur District with a theme “Leaving no one Behind”. 1114 members were participated from 30 Schools along with 60 Teachers.

The project invited application from school for Dettol Swachh Vidhyalaya Puraskar Award and thereby App designed by Collective Good Foundation was uploaded in Google play store. The school teachers downloaded and applied for the award. This was Scrutinized by District Education Department and Block level Selection Committees.

- District level Swachh Vidyalaya Puraskar Award Ceremonies were held in both the districts and selected schools were awarded by the District Collector of Thiruvallur district and District Rural Development Agency Project Director of Perambalur District. The Students’ cultural events and exhibitions had stolen the show. The District Child Protection Officer, Chief Educational Officer, Assistant Project Officer, Samagra Shiksha and Mr. Arjun Prasad, Sr. Project Manager were participated.

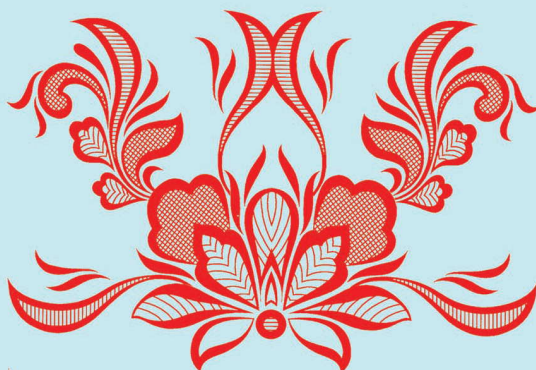
### Introduction of Fortified Rice (FR) in one district of Tamil Nadu through Public Distribution System (PDS) in partnership with JPAL”

Agreement between Nutrition International (NI) and Avvai village welfare society (Avvai) got signed on 24th September 2019. Following to that Avvai prepared job description with the guidance and support from National Program Manager - Fortification, NI and advertised in Indeed.com.

As a preparatory activity to conduct trainings, Avvai has prepared a draft Training Module as based on the guidance of National Program Manager – Fortification, NI and the same has been submitted for approval.

However, the project is yet to receive approval from the State Government towards blending and distribution of fortified rice through PDS, hence the desired outcomes could not be achieved. Based on information from NI, Avvai understand that the state government of Tamil Nadu has directed JPAL to validate the test results of blended fortified rice from a government owned laboratory, following which government is expected to approve the implementation of the project activities. In mean time, as per the direction of NI and new addendum, printing of IEC materials was on the process.

In the operational spot of Cuddalore, Blending machine ran for 20 Minutes as periodical to get warm up, rice spillages around the lots are cleaned and kept in the palla bag, placed three organic light traps to check for any insects in the rice stored and Godown was cleaned and kept neat.

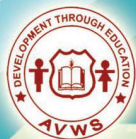

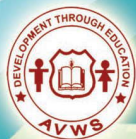

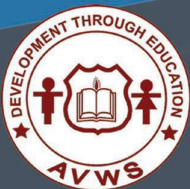
