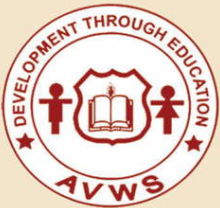

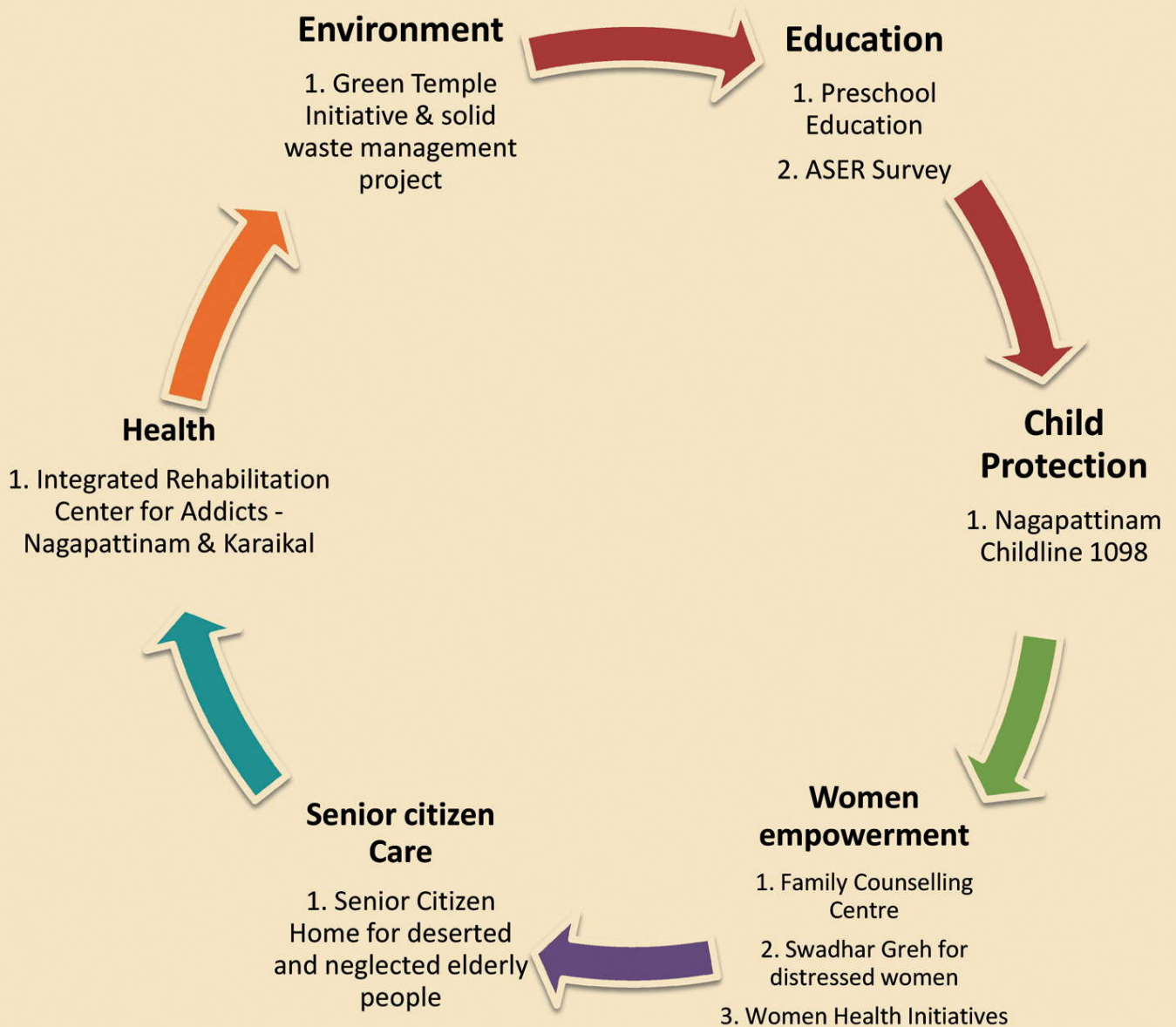
Mission

Areas of Work





Preprimary Education :

At a Glance :

1. Pre-Primary Education: 15 Creche centers in the rural remote villages of Nagapattinam district, TamilNadu.
2. Reached out to 452 underprivileged children. Out of that 214 are boys and 238 are girls.
3. 148 children who crossed age of 5 enrolled at nearby School to continue their primary education.
4. Parents meetings were organized and totally 2633 members were participated.
5. 169 pregnant women and 544 children got vaccinated and 402 children received Vitamin A solution.

Pre-Primary Education :

- Avvai has reached 452 underprivileged children through 15 creche centers under National Creche Center Scheme at Nagapattinam. The children were educated with pictorial charts and also educated on moral studies, human relations and gardening. The syllabus prepared during periodical staff meeting was utilized to educate the children.
- With the help and support of local Village Health Nurse, assisted ANC & PNC mothers on providing IFA tablets, vitamin A solution to under five children, immunization and other health related issues at village level. As a result, 169 pregnant women and 544 children got vaccinated and 402 children received Vitamin A solution.
- Organized 12 Parents meetings and discussed on important events to be celebrated at Creche centers, cooperation for successful oral polio vaccination, sanitation practice, birth & death registration, importance of IFA, personal hygiene, Anganwadi Day Celebration and creche centre management.
- 148 children who have completed age of 5 were enrolled in nearby Govt. Primary school to continue their primary education.
- At this reporting period, the Child Development Programme Officer have visited the Creche centers and given her guidance and suggestion.





Child Protection :

At a Glance :

1. 559 intervention calls from Children in Need of Care and Protection (CNCP) were addressed through Nagapattinam Childline 1098 project in Nagapattinam District.
2. The CNCP rescued were handed over to Child Welfare Committee as per ICPS' guidelines and rules.
3. 4615 children and 34590 general public were sensitized on child rights, child protection, preventive measures and legal aspects with pictorial charts.
4. Conducted Childline Advisory Board meeting under the chairmanship of the District Collector, Nagapattinam and advocated on child protection issues.
5. Promoted network with likeminded institutions and created whatsapp group to address children issues then and there.
6. Advocated on rights and entitlements of children in need of care and protection

Nagapattinam Childline 1098 :

- At this reporting period, the project received 598 calls and out of that 559 were intervention calls. The children rescued were produced before Child Welfare Committee and given care and protection.
- 46 out of school children were successfully rejoined at schools through continuous initiation of Childline team with parents, schools and the community.
- 46 out of school children were successfully rejoined at schools through continuous initiation of Childline team with parents, schools and the community.
- Reached 48 schools through obtaining a circular from Chief Education Officer and educated the school children on child helpline services and child protection mechanism and thereby 4870 children, 195 teachers and Headmasters were sensitized. As a result, 46 intervention calls were received.
- Conducted 352 awareness, 12 open house events and 418 outreach programmes in Nagapattinam district and reached 37513 people.
- Established Exhibition booth on childline services at Book stall festival and sensitized 5670 people on child helpline services through handbills distribution in Nagapattinam District.
- Sensitized 241 auto, van and lorry drivers & cleaners on child helpline services through 12 awareness programmes and thereby 28 intervention calls were received and addressed.
- 684 SHG members were sensitized on child rights and child protection with pictorial charts and thereby 33 intervention calls were received.
- 19 children missed in crowd at Nagore Kandhoori festival was rejoined with parents with the help of Police Information Centre.
- Childline Advisory Board (CAB) meeting was organized under the chairmanship of the District Collector, Nagapattinam and advocated on rights and entitlements of children in need of care and protection.
- Weekly staff review meetings were conducted and thereby detailed action plans were derived and effective intervention strategies were framed and dealt child protection issues.





- Conducted 06 mass awareness programmes and sensitized 3745 general public by taking up issues pertaining to child trafficking, child labour and importance of girl child education. 1254 phone testings were done and ensured good connectivity of tele communication.
- As part of Velankanni festival, Nagapattinam Childline, DCPU and DSWO were jointly organized special outreach, bands were tied on the hands of children coming from outside areas in which the child's address and phone numbers were written. In this outreach 12 children were rescued and handed over to their parents.
- Sensitized 60 child welfare police officers and participated in 6 Village level Child Protection Committee held at Vedharanyam and Nagapattinam.
- The City Coordinator from Childline India Foundation (CIF) did online review and given her guidance and suggestion.





Women Empowerment Project :

At a Glance :

1. Provided holistic and integrated services to women in difficult circumstances by providing shelter, food, clothing, health care, counselling and legal support.
2. Promoted health awareness through BCC methods among women and adolescent girls on nutrition & anemia, menstrual hygiene management, RTI/STI & Cervical & Breast Cancer management.
3. Supported with seeds to promote kitchen garden to women with Iron deficiency
4. Increased social awareness on care for the homeless and the abandoned
5. Established network with local Health care services, Free Legal Aid, NGOs and other Government Department

Vidiyal - Family Counseling Centre :

- At this reporting period, 285 women in difficult circumstances were addressed through family counseling center. Out of that 251 were reintegrated with family and 34 were referred to various service home for care and support.
- Organized 02 subcommittee meetings and thereby 8 clients were rehabilitated with support of committee members on obtaining legal support and services.
- The project in coordination with District Social Welfare Office, All women police station and Free legal aid organized 48 awareness programmes and sensitized 1612 on Women rights, domestic violence act, women helpline services, sexual violence and its preventive measures, addiction and its ill-effect, impact of addiction over family, life skills and spirituality.
- Besides above awareness programme, the counsellors attend periodical meetings conducted at All women police station, family court and collectorate and address the cases with technical support.
- Conducted 95 follow ups and 152 home visits and ensured welfare of cases rehabilitated through family counseling center.
- Observed World Women`s Day and thereby 430 women SHG members were participated and the programme educated on women rights and functions of service sectors.
- The Joint Secretary from Tamilnadu Social Welfare Board, District Social Welfare Officer & Protectin Officer Nagapattinam visited the project and given guidance.



Adaikalam – Sakthi Sadan Programme :

- At this reporting period, the Sakthi Sadan Programme has taken care of 109 women and 41 children who had come out of difficult circumstances. 82 were newly admitted and 80 residents were discharged. At present, 29 women and 09 children are taken care at Home.
- Out of 80 discharged cases, 48 were restored with parents and spouse, 18 with relatives, 02 with NGO and 12 were self employed.
- 100 residents were trained on vocational trades such as tailoring, Basket making, Embroidering, Paper cover making and Jamikky work.

- Conducted 38 awareness programmes and totally 3678 members were participated. The programme focused on women rights, legal provisions, domestic violence act 2005, dowry act, marriage act and functions of various allied systems such as Free legal Aid, services of All Women Police Station and women helpline.
- Organized 04 Home committee meetings and discussed on rehabilitation of clients, quality of services, restoration issues and legal support.
- All residents were provided with nutritious food, clothing, medical facilities and recreation. Medical officers visited the home four times in a month and examined the residents' health on a regular basis.
- 118 Home visits and 112 Follow ups were done and found women self employed and leading a happy life.
- Celebrated different religious events such as pongal, diwali, vinayar chaturthi, Auyuda pooja, independence day and women's day with cultural events and programmes.
- Conducted free medical camps and availed health care services from General Hospital, Nagapattinam for the residents to lead a healthy life.
- The Joint Director, Department of Social Welfare, District Social Welfare Officer, Nagapattinam, One Stop Centre, and the District Supply Officer have visited the Home several times, interacted with clients about the services, verified the documents and given guidance.



Women Empowerment Project :

- Organised Street Theatre programme in 05 villages as an entry programme of the project. The street theatre focused on Nutrition and anemia, Menstrual Hygiene Management & Cervical and Breast Cancer Management. During the programme the people were sensitized on causes of anemia, intake of iron rich foods, casues of anemia, importance of nutrition for adolescent girls and women, govt schems such as IFA supplements, ICDS services, menstrual hygiene, myths and misconception, importance of hygiene practices, causes of cervical and breast cancer, its symptoms, early prevention, early diagnosis,



facilities available in Govt. general hospital. Totally 20 programmes were conducted and 3740 people were participated.

- Promoted 83 women groups and 17 adolescent groups in all 05 villages with 25 members in each group. 2500 group members were sensitized on Nutrition and anemia, Menstrual Hygiene Management & Cervical and Breast Cancer Management through BCC method.
- Welspun CSR Head Mrs. Shilpa visited the project in Nagapattinam. She has participated in BCC sessions held in Palaiyur, Kothamangalam and Agarakonthai village on Nutrition and anemia and interacted with participants. She motivated the staff team and also appreciated the efforts of community mobilization.
- At this year, from 15th Feb 2023, another 05 villages from Karaikal District were chosen as project villages namely Oduthurai, Neravy, Kakamozhi, Keelamani and Keelavour.
- To facilitate and ease rural people in accessing the health institution Welspun Foundation for Health & Knowledge (WFHK), a CSR social arm of the Welspun Group with partner NGO Avvai village welfare society has organized Multi-speciality medical camp in 03 villages namely Sellur, Agarakonthai and Thethi villages of Nagapattinam district and 534 beneficiaries have attended the camp by consulting to various specialities doctors and benefited.




Ramya participated in medical camp held at Sellur and shared her vision problem. The doctor recommended for further eye check up. Thereby, she was taken to Vinayaka mission hospital and the Avvai- welspun project supported with spectacle at free of cost.

- Organized International Women's Day programme , 270 women from 05 project were participated. 20 women who have achieved in different fields were awarded with shields. The Welspun Deputy General Manager, the Safety Department Head and Thethi Panchayat president were motivated the women and awarded.



- The project supported 10 entrepreneurs (2 from each village) with sanitary napkins and motivated them to make it available to adolescent girls and women in rural villages. Each SN entrepreneur supported with 70 pieces of stayfree Sanitary napkins.
- Observed International Menstrual Hygiene Day in all 05 project villages by joining hands with Primary Health Centre (PHC) of Themangalam and Thirumarugal Block of Nagapattinam District. Pictorial chart presentation, signature campaign and sensitization programme on menstrual hygiene were the activities conducted in each village. Totally 755 were benefited.
- Organized National Nutrition Day Celebration in all 05 operational villages with the participation of ICDS centre and local panchayat and thereby reached 236 people. The women members did demonstration on low cost nutrition and the Anganwadi worker exhibited importance of nutrition by decorating rangoli. All were motivated with prizes.

Nonprofit organisations sensitise women to menstrual hygiene

TWO nonprofit organisations sensitised hundreds of rural women in Nagapattinam district on the importance of menstrual hygiene on Menstrual Hygiene Day, which fell on Saturday.

Avvai Village Welfare Society, in collaboration with Welspun Group, reached out to hundreds of women in Agarakondagai, Kothamangalam, Palaiyayur, Sellor and Theethi and conducted awareness programmes in community halls in the villages.

Around 80 to 100 women, who were part of all-women self-help groups in the villages, participated in each of the programmes. Medical officers Dr M Priyatharshini, Dr K Athavan, and Dr Karpagam and village health nurses Gokila and Geetha stressed on the importance of menstrual hygiene and talked to them about the 'dos' and 'don'ts' during menstruation.

Event organisers and medical experts emphasised the global theme of Menstrual Hygiene Day-making menstruation 'normal' by 2030. They also stressed on the overarching goal of building a world where no one was held back by menstruation.





Senior Citizens Care :

At a Glance :

1. Enhanced health status, social relationship and self esteem of the vulnerable elders by providing peaceful home shelter care and social awareness.
2. Vulnerable and neglected elders are supported with shelter, nutrition, medical care, counseling and entertainment in the Senior Citizen Home functioning at Samanthanpettai & Kivelur of Nagapattinam District.
3. Network with Government departments and other likeminded institutions on promoting better care to the elderly.
4. Celebrated vital events and advocating on rights of the elderly.

Anubhavam Home for Senior Citizens :

- The Home for Senior Citizens provided love and care to 55 residents who are vulnerable and neglected from the society. At this reporting period, 15 residents were newly admitted, 14 of them were reunited with their families and 01 resident expired due to old age. At present there are 40 residents (Male 10 and Female 30).
- Organized 10 medical camps in coordination with Govt. PHC, Rotary & Rotary Wings and thereby the residents got recovered from general health issues and treated for sugar, blood pressure and other ailments. The project extends its special thanks to Apollo for supporting with medicine and other hygiene kits.
- Out of 40 elders, 38 of them participate in yoga session taught in the Home every day. The elders learn at early morning and practice at late evening. They enjoy doing yoga and feel relaxed.
- The active elders at Home are maintaining a garden and watering the plants as part of recreation. More than that, reading newspaper, watching television, hearing radio, drawing pictures and doing handicraft work and playing indoor games at leisure time.
- Considering Best Performance of the project, the District Collector, Nagapattinam appreciated and supported with Cash Prize of Rs.10,000/- and motivated with shield and certificate on Republic Day.
- World Elders Day, International Yoga Day, Family festival was organised and the residents proved their skill by dancing, singing, yoga etc.. The District Collector, District Social Welfare Officer and other stakeholders appreciated and given prizes.
- The project leveraged material donations like household materials, clothes, tube lights, motor, charger light, trunk box and entertainment items. The kind hearted donors were thanked in person and through letter communication. The project extends its special thanks to Mr. Siva and Rotary Wings for supporting towards renovating Home building.

- The Karaikal FM Radio covered the entire programme held on World Elders Day and telecasted. The residents joyfully participated and shared their experience.
- Diwali, Pongal, Independence & Republic Day, Karthigai, Authapooja and other local festivals were celebrated with residents by organizing different cultural programmes & events. The donors, well wishes, college students, women self help groups, government officials and NGO staffs were participated and enjoyed the Day along with elders.
- With the support of the District Administration, the project leveraged Old Age Pension for 38 residents out of 40. The residents utilize the money for meeting out their personal needs.
- The Home was nicely renovated and painted and promoted family admosphere for all the residents. The project extends its lovable thanks to the District Collector for all his dedicated support and for participating in events organized by the project.
- At this reporting period, the District Collector, Chairman, Fisheries Development Corporation, Chennai, Superintendent of Police, Municipal Commissioner, District Social Welfare Officer, District Civil Supply Officer, Thasildar, Fire Service Station master, Lead District Manager, were visited the Home several times and given their guidance and suggestions.

Anubhavam Old Age Home- Case Study

Ambujam Home for Senior Citizens :

- The project Ambujam Home for Senior Citizens has taken care of 30 vulnerable residents and given homely atmosphere
- 05 Elders were newly admitted to the Home 05 residents were reunited with their families successfully. At present, 25 residents (Male 09 Female-16) were taken care and given homely atmosphere.



- The project organized 12 medical camps in collaboration with local Govt. Hospital and Clinics. All elders were participated and obtained free medicines and treatment for the ailments. Eye check-ups and Blood test were done for elders and supported with free medicine.

- The elders at Home are joyfully involving in gardening, art & paintings, drawing rangoli, cultural and other recreational activities. At important days, elders are involved in games and sports activities and enjoy the day with children & general public.



- The elders at Home are entertained on watching Television, reading newspaper, visiting nearby temple, helping each other etc. The MSW students from Trichy and Karaikal College who come for Block placement organized different cultural events and issued prizes.
- The project was visited by the District Social Welfare Officer, Rotary & Lions club members, Thasildar, Ward member and Extension officer and given guidance. Moreover, they celebrated importance Days and Events like Pongal & Diwali, Independence Day, Republic Day and World Elders Day along with elders and enjoyed by providing sweets and food to them.



- Medical team from Thevour Govt. Hospital under National TB control Programme did x-ray to all the residents and given awareness about TB and Fire Safety demonstration was done and enriched knowledge of staff on fire safety.
- The project mobilized material donations like clothes, groceries and recreational items from the community and CBOs like Rotary Club, Self Help Groups and individual donors. As part of continuous effort, 18 vulnerable elders are receiving OAP this year.
- The Project satisfied of its services to the vulnerable elders of providing food, shelter, medical support, meditation and recreation. The activities such as medical camps, periodical get-together meetings, celebration of festivals and recreational activities given wider scope to elders to feel at home. The elders at the project also enjoy love and care of Govt officials and other general public who visit them periodically at Home and at vital events.





Health Projects :

At a Glance :

1. 354 addicts were rehabilitated successfully by medical and psychological therapies.
2. 5292 were sensitized on ill-effect of addiction and capacitated CBOs and community stakeholders on addiction is a disease.
3. Conducted Alcoholic Anonymous Meetings and appreciated sober with motivation prizes.
4. Promoted network with likeminded institutions and advocated on drug abuse prevention and its consequences.

Puthumalar- Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts : Nagapattinam

- During the reporting period, the project admitted 187 drug addicts and provided medical and psychological treatment. Out of that 176 drug addicts were teated successfully.
- Conducted 2112 Individual Counseling and in that, the counselor helps the patient to understand that total abstinence is the goal, make them realize the damage caused by alcoholism, help to share the feelings of anger, loneliness, fear and shame, guide to develop short term and long term goal for recovery and make them understand the need for follow up.
- Conducted 264 Group therapies and in that the counselor guides the group of patients by offering a unique opportunity to share and identify with others who are going through similar problems. Talking about their drinking and adverse behavior helps to understand their powerlessness over alcohol.
- Family therapies were conducted and in that the counselor makes the family understand that alcoholism is a disease and helps to develop a supportive attitude towards the alcoholic and get back to a functional life style.
- Every morning yoga therapy was organized for drug addicts and facilitated for successful treatment.
- 278 home visits and 312 follow up were made to prevent relapse. Totally 176 cases were fully recovered at this year.
- Conducted 48 awareness programme on ill-effect of addiction to high risk groups and thereby 2670 members were participated and benefited. As a result, 22 cases were referred to the project.
- Organized 12 Alcoholic Anonymous (AA) meetings for recovered persons and motivated 06 sober with motivation prizes.
- As per the guidance of the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, organized sensitization programme on Mission Life (Lifestyle for Enviornment) and sensitized the staff team and general public and thereby 86 were benefited.



- International Day Against Drug Abuse and illicit Trafficking was observed by sensitizing 150 nursing students to disseminate the information on drug abuse prevention in their villages and working areas.
- The project strengthened its network with various departments & CBOs like Family Counselling Centre, Auto drivers Association, women & men self help groups, NGOs, village panchayats, Alcoholic Anonymous, District administration etc and ensured full-fledged treatment to drug addicts.
- The project staff team was underwent capacity building from TTK, Chennai on the topic of Group work and counseling techniques, family counseling, Prevention and Treatment process and ensure quality of services in the centre.
- The officials from NISD, District Child Protection Officer, and officials from TTK and were visited the project and given guidance and suggestion.

Gandhiji - Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts- Karaikal :

- During the reporting period, the centre admitted 189 drug addicts out of that 178 drug addicts were treated successfully. Conducted 2136 individual counseling, 260 group therapy, 51 family therapy and yoga & meditations for drug addicts to make the treatment successful. 224 home visits and 311 regular follow up counseling sessions were conducted and ensured sobriety. The relapse cases were identified through Home visits and they were motivated and treated under relapse management treatment.
- The project organized 50 awareness programmes focussing on key topics such as Addiction is a disease, impact of addiction over family especially children, Treatment procedures and community management. Flip charts, handbills, pictorial posters and flex banners are used to educate the participants. The school & ITI students, VHN, SHGs, sanitary workers, NYK volunteers and general public 1872 were sensitized.
- As per the guidance of the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, organized sensitization programme on Mission Life (Lifestyle for Environment) and sensitized the staff team and general public and thereby 85 were benefited.



- Alcoholic Anonymous (AA) meetings were conducted and 22 sober patients were participated. AA members from Kumbakonam and Mayiladuthurai shared about their achievements with new patients. This supported the new patients to see the merits to stay away from alcohol. This enhanced their motivation to stay sober and improve the quality of their lives.

As per the circular dated 22nd March 2023 from the Under Secretary to the Government

- of India, MSJE, New Delhi, Avvai village welfare society has organized several events considering Nasha Mukta Bharat Abhiyaan (NMBA) in Karaikal and Nagapattinam Districts. Rangoli competition, Awareness song singing competition, Skit on Substance abuse and its ill-effects, Painting competition among youth, Drawing competition among children, Drama on drug abuse (impact of addiction over family) were held. Morethan 450 students were observed the above events and got sensitized on drug abuse prevention and about NMBA programme of MSJE.



- Observed International Day against Drug Abuse and illicit trafficking along with district administration at Karaikal. 150 college students, recovered clients, NSS students were participated. The sober were motivated and given prizes. The general public was sensitized on ill-effect of addiction through handbills and procession. The officials from NISD, District Social Welfare Officer, and officials from TTK and were visited the project and given guidance and suggestion.

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Environment Protection Project :

At a Glance :

1. Promoted Green temple initiatives in 95 temples through the method of turning the temple premises into zero garbage zones by recycling the organic waste from daily offerings.
2. Capacitated officials of Hindu Religious and Charitable Endowment on Green temple concepts and awarded with certificates.
3. Renovated Urinals and toilets and promoted Mothers committees in Anganwadi centers.
4. Promoted children cabinet and School management committees in schools and sensitized on their role on hygiene promotion.

WASH Schools and Green Temples in Tamilnadu :

- As part of WASH programme, constructed baby hand wash stations, Urinals and Toilets in 6 Anganwadi Centres at Zone -01 of Greater Chennai Corporation and thereby 153 Children got benefited.

'Nutritious food vital for women with anaemia'

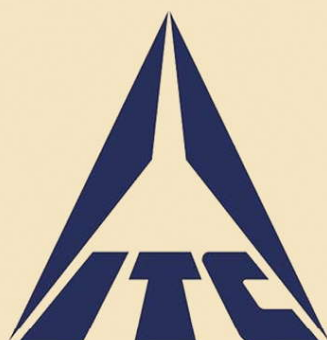

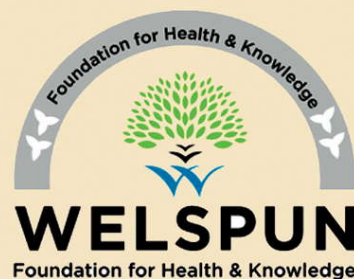

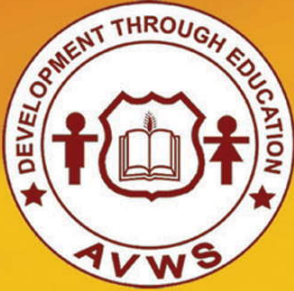
