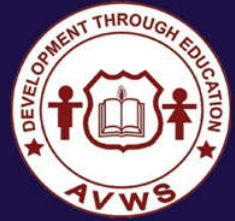

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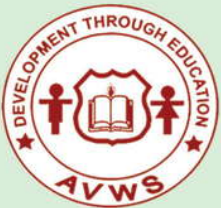

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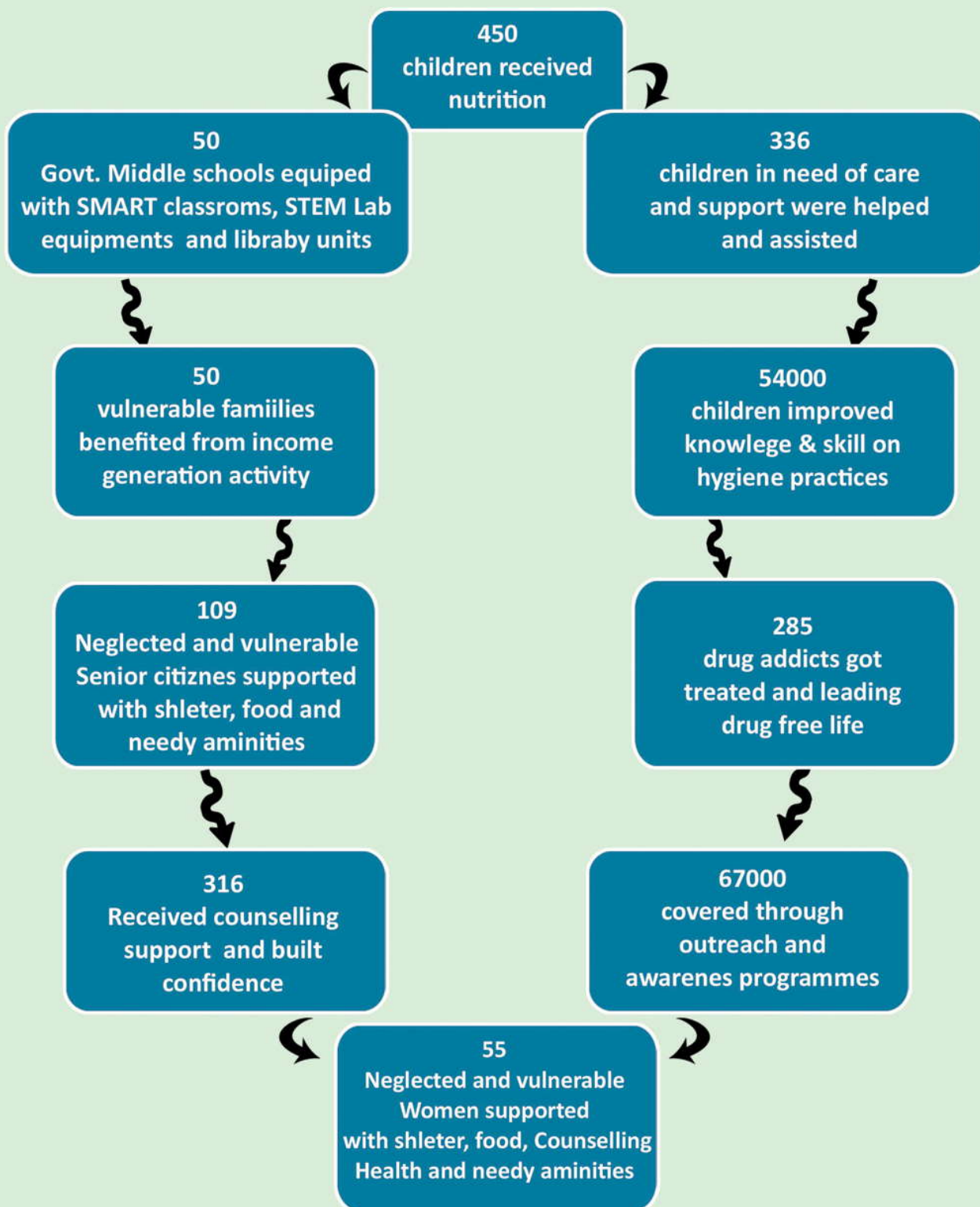

Organizational Impact





National Creche Scheme :

Goal :

Promote Day Care facilities for children below 5 years by providing nutrition and play way education in a healthy atmosphere in Nagapattinam district.

Objectives :

- To provide a healthy atmosphere for children below 5 years
- To provide nutritious food and play way education to children
- To network with Primary Health Center and provide adequate medical facilities for children
- To conduct parents meeting every month and get the community involved in the management and monitoring of Activities, especially providing infrastructure, clean water, toilet and cooking facilities.

Activities :

1. There are 15 creches in which 450 children have benefited (Boys 223 and Girls:227). At this reporting period, 145 children (79 Girls and 66 Boys) who crossed age of 5 enrolled at nearby Primary School to continue their primary education.
2. Due to COVID-19, the programme had conducted 6 Parents meetings out of 12 and 45 male and 140 female members have participated. The meetings focused on COVID-19 preventive measures, community participation, usage of medical camps and importance of education.
3. In all 15 creches, children were educated by Play way education by using colourful charts, pictures, play materials and numbers. In addition, children were educated on moral studies, human relations and gardening.
4. In coordination with nearby Primary Health Centres, the Mother club members were educated on personal hygiene, child care, immunization, low cost nutrition and preventive measures of COVID-19 and common illness.
5. Organized periodical meetings to Local Committees represented by Village panchayat, local NGO representative, Village Health Nurse and Parents on crèche management, awareness on COVID-19.
6. Ensured periodical visits of Village Health Nurse to creche centers and to the villages to carryout health related activities and awareness on COVID-19



Impact :

The Project supported 450 children successfully to obtain play way education, nutrition and better health status and enrolled 145 eligible children at nearby school to continue their primary education. In addition, the project in coordination with line departments carried out ample of awareness events on COVID-19 and ensured better health status of the community and enriched community participation towards crèche programme.



Nagapattinam Childline 1098

Goal :

Facilitate the functioning of Childline-1098 to help the children in need of Care & Protection in Nagapattinam District.

Objectives :

- To rescue and support for rehabilitation of children in need of care and protection in coordination with allied departments
- To create and sustain awareness about childline 1098 and its activities through open houses, publicity materials, linkages, school campaign, sensitization etc
- To work in collaborative with allied systems the NGOs, CBOs, SHGs, Child Welfare Committee, District Child Protection Unit (DCPU) etc., to facilitate best service to children

Activities :

1. During the reporting period, Nagapattinam Childline received 336 intervention calls consist of 3 medical assistance, 24 shelter, 16 restoration, 31 child marriage, 21 child begging, 17 child labour, 12 child sexually abuse, 1 bonded labour, 38 physical abuse, 5 missing & run away, 6 child lost, 52 emotional guidance and support, 30 sponsorship, 1 abandon child, 22 nutrition support, 13 emotional abuse, 4 referred to other childline, 2 child custody, 1 drug abuse, 1 death related case, 14 other intervention and 22 did not find.
2. Awareness programme on Childline-1098 was organized in Nagapattinam and covered 406 children, 2657 general public, 166 auto drivers & van drivers and 1985 Self Help Group members. Totally 8500 handbills were distributed to the participants and educated through outreach, Street theatre and IEC materials.
3. Conducted 9 school awareness campaigns on childline-1098 and 907 school students and teachers were benefited (105 were Boys, 749 were girls & 53 teachers). The programme covered 09 High & Higher secondary schools.
4. Childline Advisory Board (CAB) meeting was organized under the leadership of the District Collector Nagapattinam. Totally 27 members from allied departments were participated. The meeting enhanced smooth relationship between Childline 1098 and allied departments on addressing children in need of care and protection



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5. Organized Child Rights Week/Se-dhosti event in 8 villages. The children and adult participated in cultural programme on child marriage, awareness session, Quiz competition and totally 344 were participated. The event was presided by the Child Development Project Officer, Nagapattinam.



6. Considering COVID-19, the project has organized drawing and poem online competition and winners were awarded with prizes. The District Legal Service Authority Sub-Judge and Professor Arignar Anna Collage were presided and motivated the children with certificates. Totally 34 children were participated.

7. Anti child labour Day was organized by district administration and thereby the team from Childline took part and sensitized the public on the day and done outreach activity in bus stand, tourist spot etc and thereby 148 were sensitized.

8. The Childline 1098 with the support of Goonj and District Social Welfare Office assisted 1264 vulnerable families with groceries and hygiene kits in 12 villages.

9. International Girl Child Day was observed in Nambiyar Nagar and thereby 35 children and adult were participated. The Day focused on motivating girl children by identifying their skills on sports, education etc and awarded with prizes. The Child Welfare Committee, District Child Protection Unit and local Panchayat were presided.

10. The Childline team involved in operation smile activity and thereby in 04 blocks of Nagapattinam 24 children were rescued and restored with parents along with the team of Police, DCPU and Labour Dept.

11. The project strengthened its relationship with various allied departments on addressing children in distress such as Police, Dept. of Telecommunication, Hospitals, Swadhar greh, Child Welfare Committee, Juvenile Justice Board, Social Welfare Dept, ICDS, Dept of Labour Welfare, DLSA and other agencies working for the cause of deprived, excluded and vulnerable children.

Impact :

The Nagapattinam Childline-1098 project successfully intervened with 336 cases with the support of allied system and rehabilitated. During the course of period, the project further strengthened its healthy relationship with allied departments and dealt ample of child right issues in coordination with supportive services and through CAB meeting.



“Adaikalam” Swadhar Greh

Goal :

Ensuring holistic development of women and girls under distress through counseling and Rehabilitation measures in Nagapattinam District

Objectives :

- To create social awareness on care for the homeless and the abandoned
- To ensure safe and healthy atmosphere for women and girls under distress
- To provide them information on self reliance legal matters and rehabilitation
- To establish network with other Free Legal Aid, NGOs and other Government Departments

Activities :

1. At this reporting period, the project taken care of 55 inmates and 22 children under distress through counseling support.

28 inmates were admitted newly and 28 inmates

2. were rehabilitated and rejoined with their parents and spouse. At present, 27 inmates and 07 children are taken care at Home.

3. Conducted 12 medical camps, 04 awareness events, 24 tele-counseling and 1 referral.

4. Vocational trainings were provided to 30 inmates on 12 tailoring, embroidering, 10 basket making, 08 cover making and flower garland. 22 inmates were self-employed after discharge from the Home.

5. As a precautionary measures of COVID 19, the project in coordination with local govt. hospital verified temperature of inmates periodically, conducted awareness meet, given herbal drinks, sanitized the premises and provided mask and sanitizers to all the inmates.

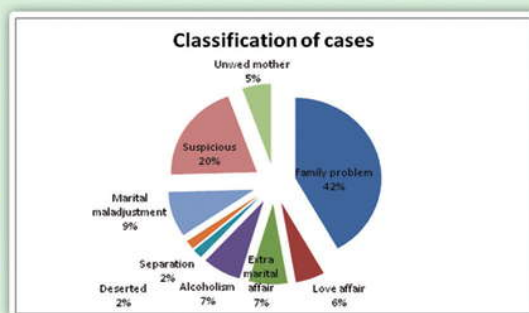
6. Inmates are taken out to temples and other open space for outings as recreation. Periodical yoga classes were conducted 3 per week.

7. Celebrated important days and festivals such as Diwali, Pongal, Gokul Astami, Vinayahar Sathurthi, Republic day, Independence day, Ayudha Pooja and Women's Day along with District stakeholders and given prizes.

8. District social welfare officer, Thasildar, Siddha doctor and One staff centre officials were visited the project and given guidance.

Impact :

The project successfully reunited 28 deserted inmates with their family members through counseling process and made them self-employed by providing vocational skill. In addition, the Project sensitized on women rights and promoted healthy relationship with line departments on addressing women under difficult circumstances.





“Vidiyal” Family Counseling Center

Goal :

Promoting harmonious family life among people living in Nagapattinam District

Objectives :

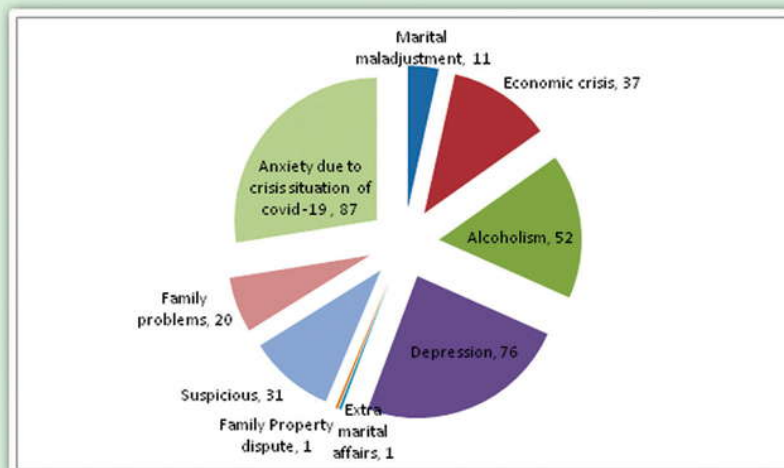
- To minimize family problem arising out of alcoholism ,domestic violence, dowry problem, etc...in Nagapattinam district.
- To provide information on legal rights on women and link women with resources locally available.
- To establish linkages with the police departments, DLSA, DSW, hospitals, NGOs, CBOs, etc to address issues together.

Activities :

1. Counseled 316 cases out of that 280 cases were rehabilitated successfully. Out of which, 222 cases were rejoined with family, 25 medical help, 18 cases benefited under government welfare scheme, 15 cases obtained job benefits.
2. Conducted 90 follow up and 240 home visit and ensured welfare of cases rehabilitated through family counseling center.
3. The project conducted 18 village level awareness programmes on women rights, domestic violence, women helpline and function of Free legal aid in Nagapattinam region. 310 women and 72 men were participated in the programme. As a result, received 115 cases to the project from the general public.
4. The family counseling center has healthy relationship with allied system and thereby dealt 12 cases in coordination with All women police station, 14 cases with Family court, 01 case referred to short stay home, 04 cases dealt with Free Legal Aid and 21 cases referred to de-addiction cum rehabilitation center.



Classification of cases :





6. As per the guidance of Tamil Nadu Social Welfare Board and Secretary of Social Welfare, the project conducted 64 tele-counseling to Senior citizens and 122 to general public during COVID-19 lockdown period.
7. Organized 01 subcommittee meeting and discussed about the awareness creation on COVID-19 and tele-counseling to depressed and anxious people calling for support.
8. The Joint Secretary from Tamil Nadu State Social Welfare Board and District Social Welfare Officer, Nagapattinam were visited the project and given guidance.

Impact :

Family counseling centre has counseled 316 cases out of that 280 cases were rehabilitated successfully in coordination with supportive services. It also extended its support of counseling and guidance to cases registered at All women police station , Free legal aid and District social welfare office. The centre also satisfied of its services rendered for poor and vulnerable through counseling and rehabilitation measures to lead a happy life.

“ANUBHAVAM” Home for Senior Citizens

Goal :

Enhancing health status, social relationship and self esteem of the vulnerable elders by providing peaceful home shelter care and social awareness.

Objectives :

- To enhance social awareness on elder care in the community
- To carryout social, psychological and material assistance to needy elders
- To identify neglected and socially handicapped elders in the communities
- To provide a healthy family environment to the elders admitted in home
- To ensure nutritional, medical, entertainment and other preliminary needs of elders in the home.
- To engage in resource mobilization activities.

Activities :

1. At this reporting period, 10 deserted elders (02 male and 08 female) were newly admitted in Home and 05 elders (02 male and 03 female) were reunited with their families successfully. Due to old age, 02 inmates in which 01 female and 01 male were passed away. Funerals were held according to their wishes and culture. Totally the project taken care of 50 elders this year. At present there are 40 inmates at Home out of which 07 are male 33 are female.



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2. Conducted 03 medical camps and 40 elders were participated. Apart from medical camps, periodical health checkup were held in coordination with Primary Health Centre & HelpAge India once in a month. The project thank Apollo for extending free medicine and COVID 19 hygiene kits.
3. Celebrated important days and festivals such as Diwali, Pongal , Vinayahar Sathurthi, Republic day, Independence day, World Elders Day and Ayudha Pooja along with community members and crèche children. The elders feel at home and enjoy the day with school children and community people.
4. As a precautionary measures of COVID 19, the project in coordination with local govt. hospital verified temperature of inmates periodically, conducted awareness meet, given herbal drinks, sanitized the premises and provided mask and sanitizers to all the inmates.
5. The project leveraged material donations like buckets, electric lamps, clothes, household materials and entertainment items. The kind hearted donors were thanked in person and through letter communication.
6. Newspaper reading, watching television programs, hearing radio, cleaning home environment and group singing are some of the periodical entertainment activities conducted at Home. The inmates forget their worries and interestingly involved in these activities.
7. The project conducted 04 yoga classes per week with trained yoga master. 18 able elders were participated regularly and got relief from breathing trouble, pain in the Knee and fists.
8. The project leveraged Old Age Pension for 24 elders (4 male and 20 female) and applied for 8 (2 male and 6 female)elders this year from Govt.
9. District Collector, Nagapattinam, Health Secretary of Tamil Nadu, District Social Welfare Officer, Assistant Medical Officer, Taluk Supply Officer, Chief Education Officer, District Legal Service Authority officers and Elders Helpline officer, Thasildar were visited the project and given guidance.

Impact :

The project satisfied of its lovable services to marginalized elders at Home by providing ample of welfare services. The elders enjoy the services provided by the project on ensuring their health and mental status. Yoga, health camps, recreation and nutrition support improved physical and mental wellbeing of elders at Home. Community awareness on elder care enriched people's participation towards the project.



“Ambujam” Home for Senior Citizens

Goal :

Enhancing health status, social relationship and self esteem of the vulnerable elders by providing peaceful home shelter care and social awareness.

Objectives :

- To enhance social awareness on elder care in the community
- To carryout social, psychological and material assistance to needy elders
- To identify neglected and socially handicapped elders in the communities
- To provide a healthy family environment to the elders admitted in home
- To ensure nutritional, medical, entertainment and other preliminary needs of elders in the home.
- To engage in resource mobilization activities.

Activities :

1. During the reporting period, the project taken care of 34 vulnerable elders and given homely atmosphere (Male 07 & Female 27).
2. 5 Elders (Male -1 & Female -4) were newly admitted to the Home 5 Elders were reunited with their families (Female-5) successfully.
3. At present, 25 elders (Male 07 -Female-18) were taken care and given homely atmosphere. The project organized 12 medical camps in collaboration with local Govt. Hospital & HelpAge India. All elders were participated and obtained free medicines and treatment for the ailments. The project thank Apollo for extending free medicine and COVID 19 hygiene kits.
4. The elders were engaged in preparing basket making and gardening as a recreation and entertainment activities. Television, daily newspaper and outings were being recreation for elders.
5. The project organized periodical get-together meetings for elders by inviting local resource persons and oriented on legal rights, personal hygiene, nutrition, spirituality, interpersonal relationship and importance of Meditation.



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6. Importance Days and Events were celebrated and observed like Pongal, Diwali, Independence Day, Republic Day and World Elders Day in coordination with District Administration and local stakeholders. Musical chair, rangoli and cultural programmes were conducted and given prizes.
7. As a precautionary measures of COVID 19, the project in coordination with local govt. hospital verified temperature of inmates periodically, conducted awareness meet, given herbal drinks, sanitized the premises and provided mask and sanitizers to all the inmates.
8. The District Social Welfare Officer, Revenue Divisional Officer, Civil Supply Officer, RRTC and MSJE, local MLA and Extension Officer were visited the centre and given guidance. In addition to that, as per the guidelines of the Ministry, CCTV cameras were installed and linked in organization website.
9. The project mobilized material donations like clothes, groceries and recreational items from the community and CBOs like Rotary Club, Self Help Groups and individual donors.

Impact :

The project satisfied of its lovable services to marginalized elders at Home by providing ample of welfare services. The elders enjoy the services provided by the project on ensuring their health and mental status. Yoga, health camps, recreation and nutrition support improved physical and mental wellbeing of elders at Home. Community awareness on elder care enriched people's participation towards the project.

“Annapoorani” Home for Senior Citizen

Goal :

Enhancing health status, social relationship and self esteem of the vulnerable elders by providing peaceful home shelter care and social awareness.

Objectives :

- To enhance social awareness on elder care in the community
- To carryout social, psychological and material assistance to needy elders
- To identify neglected and socially handicapped elders in the communities
- To provide a healthy family environment to the elders admitted in home
- To ensure nutritional, medical, entertainment and other preliminary needs of elders in the home.
- To engage in resource mobilization activities.

Activities :

1. The Annapoorani Home for Senior Citizens extended its lovable care and support to 25 senior citizens with food, shelter, counselling assistance, medical care and recreation. Out of that 5 are male and 20 are female. At this reporting period, 20 senior citizens (09 male and 11 female) were admitted newly and 20 (08 male and 12 female) were reunited with their relative/family. At present, the Home caters the need of 25 senior citizens.



2. 02 male and 11 female senior citizens were supported to receive Old Age Pension from District administration and 12 new application for OAP were given (03 male and 09 female) this year.
3. Conducted 12 medical camps and given treatment for common ailments and thereby all the elders in the home were benefited. Besides that yoga classes were conducted 3 per week and elders actively participated with interest.
4. The elders at home involved in basket making and recreational activities during leisure time and enjoy the days by having get-together and spiritual meetings.
5. World Elders' Day was observed and thereby competitions, games and prize distribution functions were held. The senior citizens actively participated in cultural programmes and enjoyed.

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6. As a precautionary measures of COVID 19, the project in coordination with local govt. hospital verified temperature of inmates periodically, conducted awareness meet, given herbal drinks, sanitized the premises and provided mask and sanitizers to all the inmates.
7. Besides providing care and support to senior citizens in the Home, the project reached 120 community members through 06 outreach services focusing on Elder care in the family and community at large.
8. Personal Assit. Collector of Ariyalur district, RRTC, MSJE, District Social Welfare Officer, ICDS Project officer, District Women Welfare Officer, GS/MS Extension Officer were visited the project and given guidance.

Impact :

The senior citizens enjoy by having get-together meeting, recreational activities and leading a dignified life by having good food, shelter and medical assistance. The project satisfied for the opportunity given to care the deserted and neglected elders with lovable services. As per the guidelines of the Ministry, CCTV cameras were installed and linked in organization website.

Elder Resource Centre :

Avvai village welfare society with the support of Social Welfare Department, Ariyalur District initiated Elder Resource Centre in Ariyalur District to improve the emotional well being of senior citizens. The resource centre is not home for the elderly to stay but more like day care centres to share their emotion, learn about welfare schemes, have get together, get assistance etc..

Pudhumalar – Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts

Goal :

Rehabilitation of Drug addicts in Nagapattinam District through Medical and psychological treatment and to make it as sober

Objectives :

- To enrich knowledge on ill-effect of alcoholism through mass communication
 - To increase the number of services rendered to alcoholic cases by 20% in one year
 - To continuously assist recovered cases through periodical meetings and Alcoholic Anonymous to maintain sobriety.
 - To network with related Departments and CBOs and to strengthen the services of the programme
1. During the reporting period, the project admitted 141 cases and provided medical and psychological treatment. Out of 141 cases, 125 cases are leading drug free life.
 2. Conducted 1692 Individual Counseling, 261 Group therapy, 50 Family therapy and 166 yoga therapy for drug addicts and facilitated for successful treatment.



3. 176 home visits and 204 follow up were made to prevent relapse. Totally 125 cases were fully recovered at this year.
4. Conducted 23 awareness programme on ill-effect of addiction to self help group members, Auto and truck drivers and thereby 762 members were participated and benefited.
5. Organized 10 Alcoholic Anonymous (AA) for recovered persons. 120 members were participated. The long term sober were appreciated and given prizes as source of motivation.
6. The project strengthened its network with various departments & CBOs like Family Counselling Centre, Auto drivers Association, women & men self help groups, NGOs, village panchayats, Alcoholic Anonymous etc and ensured full-fledged treatment to drug addicts.
7. The project staff underwent capacity building on addiction management from TTK, Chennai and ensure quality of services in the centre. As per the guidelines of the Ministry, CCTV cameras were installed and linked in organization website.
8. Considering COVID-19, the project adhered to preventive measures and guidance from District administration and ensured better hygiene practices from clients.
9. TTK Chennai, MSJE and District Child Protection Officer were visited the project and given guidance.



Impact :

The project with its commendable efforts treated 125 cases and ensured sobriety. In addition, the project strengthened its network with line departments and advocated on preventive measure of addiction in the society. Awareness generation and observation of vital events enriched knowledge on ill-effect of addiction in the community and captured community participation over the programme on rendering quality services to the addicts.

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“GANDHIJI’ –Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts

Goal :

Ensure sobriety among addicts of Karaikal and neighboring district through medical and psychological treatment.

Objectives :

- To increase the number of services rendered to alcoholic cases by 20% in one year.
- To continuously assist recovered cases so that cases of relapse is reduced by 10%.
- To organize the awareness programme on handling alcoholic cases for Government officials, private practitioners, Educational institutions and NGO's
- To network with the related departments and CBO's to strengthen the services to the entire district.

Activities :

1. During the reporting period, the centre admitted 144 cases and 115 cases were leading a drug free life.

Conducted 1152 individual counseling, 260 group therapy, 48 family therapy, 144 yoga & meditations for drug addicts to

2. make the treatment successful.

200 home visits and 297 regular follow up counseling sessions were conducted and re-ensured sobriety of 115 cases.

3. The project has organized 38 Awareness programmes on ill-effects of addiction to high risk groups, women SHG's, Youth clubs and general public and thereby 1855 were benefited.

20 Alcoholic Anonymous (AA) meetings were conducted and 438 sober patients were participated. AA members from Trichy and Mayiladuthurai hailed to the meeting and shared their peace and joyfulness of drug free life and motivated the members to remain sober.

Due to COVID-19, the project did mobile counselling and thereby 186 were benefited. The clients were sensitized on ill-effects of addiction, drug free life, counselling for depression, anxiety etc. As per the guidelines of the Ministry, CCTV cameras were installed and linked in organization website.

As per the guidelines of the District administration, the project followed preventive measures of COVID-19 in the campus and sensitized the clients on hygiene practices.

During reporting period, TTK (RRTC) chennai and MSJE visited the project and given guidance.

Impact :

The centre with its commendable effort, treated 115 addicted cases to lead a drug free life. Through various awareness and outreach programmes, the centre enhanced knowledge on ill-effect of addiction to various community groups and captured their participation to render quality services to addicts. Moreover, periodical AA meetings motivated treated clients to remain sober for longer period.





National Action Plan on Drug Demand Reduction (NAPDDR)

Goal :

Awareness building on ill-effects of drug abuse among young people in Keelialyur and Nagapattinam Block of Nagapattinam District

Objectives :

- To promote positive mental health through life skill education among young people such as polytechnic/ITI students and out of school children in High risk and vulnerable area.
- To sensitize the village stakeholders of High risk and vulnerable area on drug abuse and prevention of illicit trafficking
- To enrich knowledge on life skills among young people to lead a dignified and drug free life
- To sensitize on role of related departments and Govt. schemes on drug prevention
- Ensure linkages among police, narcotic dept, village stakeholders and youth group by involving in the programme activity.

Activities :

1. Intensive outreach activities and sensitization programme on ill-effects of drug abuse were conducted to 194 Self Help Group members through cultural programme and thereby 3887 were benefited.
2. Young people were sensitized on ill-effects of drug abuse through education session and thereby 1284 were benefited.
3. awareness events were conducted for 100 days employment workers on drug abuse and health hazards and thereby 806 were benefited.



Impact :

Due to lockdown and COVID-19 prevalence, the project found difficult to organize the people however by following the protocol on preventive measures, the programme reached 1284 young people and 3887 self help group and MNREGA members. As a result 28 were referred to IRCA centre for counselling and treatment.

Programme for Scheduled Caste

Avvai village welfare society focuses on improving the lives of scheduled caste by running different schemes. As part of that, Avvai implement Hostel for students of Scheduled caste at Trichy District. 50 girl students are getting benefited out of this Hostel. The Hostel renders food, shelter and recreation facilities at free of cost.



Programme for Scheduled Tribe

For improving the lives of scheduled tribe, Avvai village welfare society executes Hostel for 50 girl students, Mobile dispensary and 10-bedded hospital at Trichy district. The schemes address poor and vulnerable tribal community to come up in life and focuses on socio-economic development.

Community Intervention program

Goal :

Community Intervention program to control the speedy spread of pandemic Covid-19 in Chennai corporation.

Activities :

1. Area mapping was done for the easy identification of vulnerable people
2. 1200 Women were educated on corona prevention under Motivational program to Women Self Groups.
3. Education given on prevention of Covid -19 for 4200 members through Hand bills distribution.
4. Awareness Stickers were attached in 200 autos for Covid prevention
5. 1150 members were educated along with 86 children under walkhathan Program.
6. 2900 community people were educated on covid-19 by two Cultural programs organized with professional.
7. 286 people were referred for testing to Covid Testing center.
8. 264 people were undergone Covid test.
9. 37 people had the positive result
10. 8 members were admitted in Covid Care Centre, recovered and discharged
11. 5 Members were admitted to Hospital, recovered and discharged.
12. 24 people were in home isolation and treated well and recovered.
13. 27 Differently abled people were facilitated to obtain Corona relief fund of Rs.1000 each.



Impact :

The Community Intervention programme created massive awareness on COVID-19 preventive measures in and around Chennai city and helped people to get tested and treated.



Hygiene Education Programme

Goal :

Promote hygiene education among school children to bring positive behaviour change on hygiene practices and awareness building among teachers and community in Perambalur and Thiruvallur districts of Tamil Nadu.

Objectives :

- Convert the manuals into digital education and integrate the same as part SCERT e-curriculum to cover whole state
- Further re orient the Govt staff to carry forward the fruits of success in the coming year and beyond
- Work on special for advocacy and sustainability
- Reach out to the basic training centres where the prospective teachers undergo two-year training and build in the hygiene education into their curriculum

Activities :

1. Covid pandemic has really affected the livelihoods of many villagers resulted into losing of daily earnings. 750 families from Polivaakkam village of Thiruvallur District was supported with immune booster material and other essential needs.
2. In Thiruvotriyur area, awareness program was conducted to children to protect from Covid-19 by covering children of 28 schools, about 1280 children could accustomed and habituated in wearing masks and an exercise of 20 seconds hand wash was also taken up. In addition about 150 children were checked daily area by thermal scanner as pre identification.
3. Avvai on the guidelines of CGF has taken up the sensitization of the students with COVID related messages through WhatsApp groups developed with teachers. Thus the sensitization was taken up during the period from April 2nd week to June 1st week 2020 . Messages related Covid precautions, 'Personal hygiene', 'Hygiene at home' were shared in the form of text messages message & videos.





4. Team has collected the WhatsApp numbers of all teachers and Block resource and education offices and created 14 What's App groups (1 group per each Block) and there are about 930 Teachers in all groups. Addition of new teachers in group is taking up simultaneously. Through these messages we could reach about 54,000 families in state and given awareness on precautions and hygiene practices.
5. Avvai in coordination with SSA - District officers have taken up the inauguration of handwash station after its proper installation. The inauguration was taken place in two districts - Perambalur and Thiruvallur Districts. The Chief Education Officer, SMC members, Collective Good Foudantion, Block level officers were present.
6. The project organized drawing, essay and poem competition for children on hygiene education during lockdown through online and the winners were awarded with certificates and prizes. The Chief Education Officer and Collective Good Foundation were presided.
7. Wall posters on Kitchen Garden and COVID-19 preventive measures were released and sensitized the school children and teachers. The CEO realized the posters and student received it.
8. Students work books and teachers manuals were received at respective districts and supplied to Blocks for onwards distribution to Schools for children's usage.
9. One day training program was organised to BRTS of Two Blocks on 21st December – attended by 06 BRTs and 10 members from Samagra Shiksha.
10. Avvai in coordination with Samagra Shiksha and School Authorities have organised meetings with SMC (School Management Committees) wherein the focus was on to ensure the safety methods of covid-19 for students when the school are reopen, About 53 SMC meetings were organised in 10 Blocks and the total number of Participants are 312 represented 53 schools. This was conducted as model and shared in Social media i.e. Block WhatsApp groups to follow the same in all other schools.

Income Generation Programme for victims of Gaja cyclone

Goal :

Promote Income Generation for victims of Gaja cyclone in 10 villages of Keelaiyur Block, Nagapattinam District, Tamil Nadu

Activities :

1. Done telecall awareness to the public by calling parents, panchayat members, teachers and educated on preventive measures, counselling message, facts on COVID and enhanced confidence level among people in the community.
2. Promoted Village Disaster Management Committees (VDMCs) in all 10 villages headed by village traditional leaders, ward members and women Self Help Group members. Each committee consists of 5-7 members. The project conducted monthly meeting with VDMCs and the meeting focused about the project activity, selection of beneficiaries to receive support from project, follow up action and support for identification of vendors.
3. Supported 50 vulnerable families with food and non food items such as 25 kg rice, two oil packets (2 liters), other essentials such as wheat flour (15 Kg), pulses, chili powder, turmeric powder, tamarind, tea powder, salt, sugar, maida, and Rava. The families have also received non-food items such as Hygiene Kit, containing Hand Wash bars, Dettol Liquid and Tarpaulin.
4. 90% of the fruit bearing trees had been totally uprooted and caused heavy damage due to Gaja cyclone. Thereby 75 farming and marginal agri workers were supported with one mango and one coconut tree saplings each and totally in all 10 villages, 750 beneficiaries were supported with tree saplings.
5. Identified vulnerable farmers supported with goat and cow as part of income generation and thereby the project has done medical camp for animals and after certification by veterinary doctor, done insurance for one year and supported the farmers. 05 cows and 21 goats were distributed in PRPuram Panchayat and 5 cows and 19 goats were distributed in Thirupoondi East Panchayat.



Impact :

- Community participation was ensured in all the process of activities through Village Disaster Management Committees (VDMCs) promoted in 10 operational villages of Keelaiyur Block. As a result, the VDMCs actively involved on identification of vulnerable beneficiaries and supported to reap the benefits from the project. The Village Panchayat President participated in project activities and recommended beneficiaries screened by the project team to avail the benefits from the project. The entire process helped to reach the right beneficiaries who are vulnerable and need of support.
- Support of Tree saplings, milch animals and goats remained very good investment towards a long term income generation to beneficiaries. After Gaja Cyclone, the beneficiaries continuously faced several other risks like COVID-19, Nivar cyclone, hectic rain and loss of job. At this situation, the support from the project remained boon to the beneficiaries to revive their livelihood and enhanced their confidence level.



School ICT Project

Goal :

Using technology to build a learner centric environment in Government schools of Thiruvallur district cover 50 elementary schools as models with enhanced all-round development opportunity for children

Objectives :

- To develop learner friendly school infrastructure for 5000 children, 50% of which are girls
- To build the capacity of teachers on subject specific and child centric pedagogy through effective usage of ICT
- To strengthen the existing school support structures (i.e. SMCs, BRCs/CRCs, /DIETs) and demonstrate learnings from the project for wider replication

Activities :

1. The project assessed the feasibility to establish STEM lab and SMART classrooms in 50 Govt. Middle Schools of Thiruvallur District and got the consent from Education Dept. to carryout the activities.
2. BLES is an innovative approach aiming to make learning fun and enjoyable. After school assessment, the project has selected 25 Govt. middle schools which has space from 06 blocks namely Sholavaram, Poonthamalle, Poondi, Kadambathur, Thiruvallur and Ellapuram for beautifying the classrooms with wall paintings. The paintings depicted on solar system, math tables, hygiene points, angles & triangles, squares & rounds, India map with state capital, degrees and human digestion system.
3. The project had several discussions with DIET and obtained permission letter from DIET, Thiruvallur to work as HUB to all 50 Govt. Middle schools and to establish ICT materials in DIET.
4. Model unit of STEM lab and SMART classroom was established at Vengathur Govt. Middle School and it was observed by the Education Dept, Save the Children, School Management Committee, Students, Teachers and SCERT consultant and suggested to scale it up to other schools as it was innovative and useful for children to improve their learning level.
5. In continuation to establishment of model unit, the project had a Memorandum of Understanding to scale it up the model in other 49 Govt. Middle schools and in 1 DIET at Thiruvallur.
6. The project supported 50 Govt. Middle schools with library books to enhance learning level of children. The books contains, general knowledge, puzzle, moral stories, quiz etc..



Impact :

The project completely focused on improving learning level of children studying in 50 Govt. Middle Schools of Thiruvallur District. Due to COVID 19 and lockdown, the project activities got affected however the activities will be completed by April 2021 and ensure better learning environment for children at schools.

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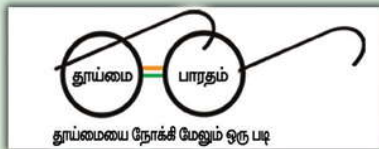

THREE non profit organisation provided milch animals and goats to farmers affected by natural calamities on Thursday. Avvai Village Welfare Society, a Nagapattinam-based organisation with the collaboration of 'Save the Children' and 'Herbalife Foundation' have come in support of 21 vulnerable farmers in Prathabaramapuram village in Keezhaiyur block. They distributed one goat each while four farmers received one cow each.

A village level committee headed by Prathabaramapuram's Panchayat President was formed to identify the beneficiaries who are in vulnerable social and economic condition. Later, the beneficiaries were screened by Avvai society staff. The animals were medically examined in front of beneficiaries with the help of Prathabaramapuram's local veterinarian, and given an insurance for one year. Around ₹3.5 lakhs was spent on distributing cattle.

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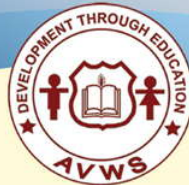
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
