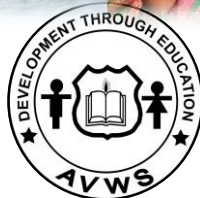

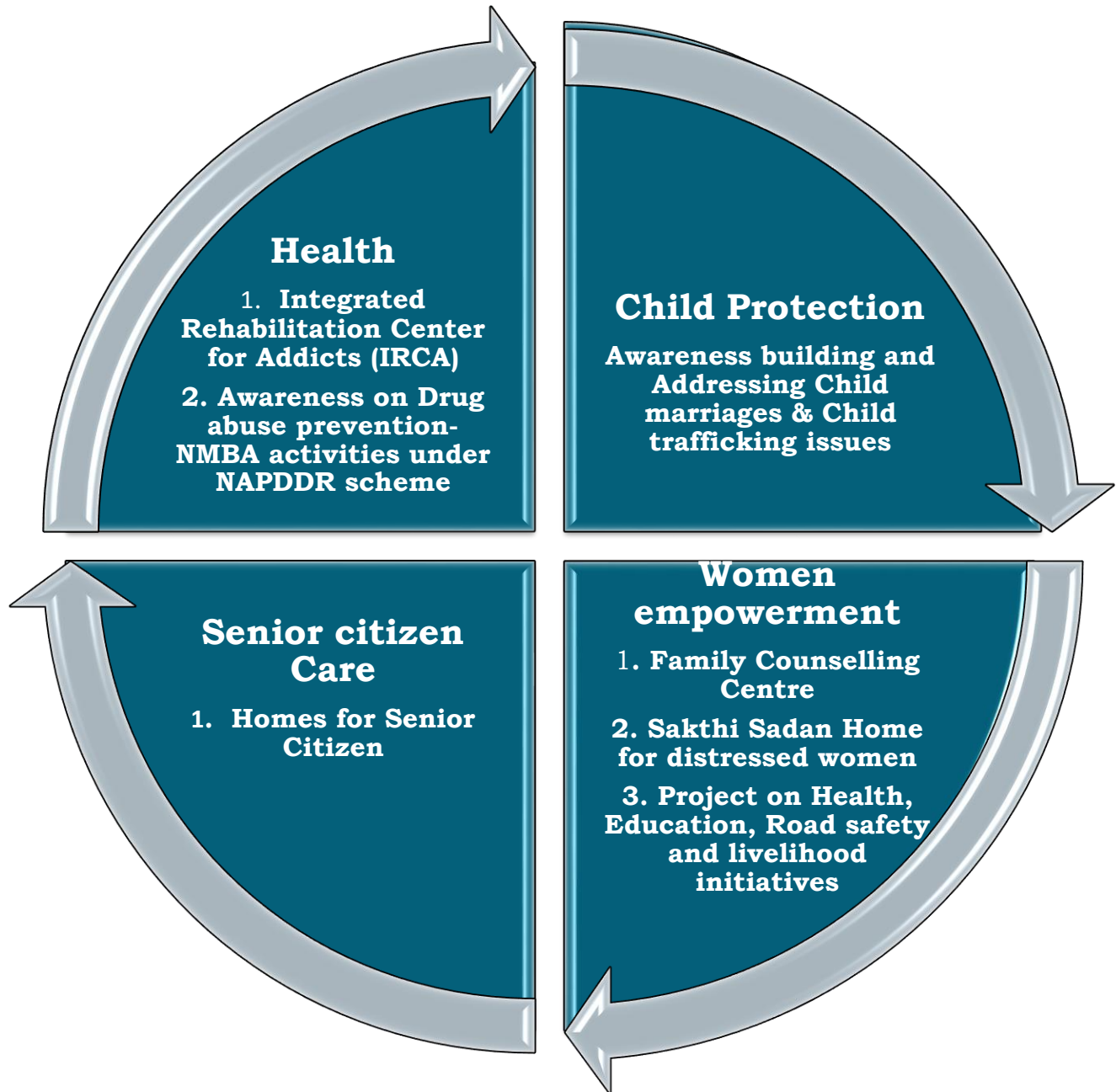

# Child Protection Project

## Goal:

Prevention and elimination of child marriage and child trafficking by ensuring awareness generation and supportive services to the victims and their families

## Objectives:

- To conduct outreach and awareness activities on child marriage and child trafficking issues
- To sensitize the stakeholders and promote hand holding support to address child protection issues
- To prevent and eliminate child marriage and child trafficking issues with supportive services
- To produce children in need of care and protection before child welfare committee for better rehabilitation and assistance
- To ensure linkages and support from like-minded institutions and Government departments

## Activities:

- Sensitized 47310 people against child marriage & child trafficking through mass awareness programmes such as awareness on wheel, group pledge, signature campaign and group meetings.
- Sensitized on legal consequences and ill-effects of child marriage and obtained 347 undertakings and 07persuasion and assisted 354 victims' families on prevention of child marriages.
- Bal Vivah Mukat Bharat campaign activities were conducted and sensitized against child marriage and its legal issues by organizing several programmes in 50 operational villages in Nagapattinam District. Morethan 15500 people were sensitized from 20<sup>th</sup> January 2026 to 8<sup>th</sup> March 2026.
- Done wall paintings at people gathering spots and developed pictorial IEC materials on ill-effects of child marriage and child trafficking issues and utilized during awareness programmes held at village level in Nagapattinam District.



- Conducted 05 social protection camps and linked 4021 vulnerable families with Govt. welfare schemes and supported on leveraging its benefits.
- Organized 03 survivors' network and sensitized the stakeholders on legal consequences of child marriage and its related issues. Totally 422 were participated and enlightened on health and legal issues of child marriages
- Sensitized 54 faith leaders and placed 50 name board in religious places and enriched awareness against child marriage.
- Organized International Girl Child Day at Thevour and sensitized 155 children on importance of education, child protection and preventive measures.
- 30 Child labour, child trafficking and child missing cases were addressed with allied systems and produced Children in Need of Care and Protection (CNCP) before Child Welfare Committee.
- Promoted 50 Village Level Child Welfare Committees and sensitized on their roles and responsibilities in all 50 operational villages.
- Conducted awareness street play against child marriage and child trafficking issues and sensitized morethan 18400 general public in all public gathering spots like bus stand, market places, nagore dharga, velankanni etc..
- Promoted awareness generation on The Prohibition of Child marriage Act, 2006 among village stakeholders and as a result 12 panchayats were passed resolutions against child marriage in Nagapattinam District.



# Vidiyal - Family Counseling Centre:

## Goal:

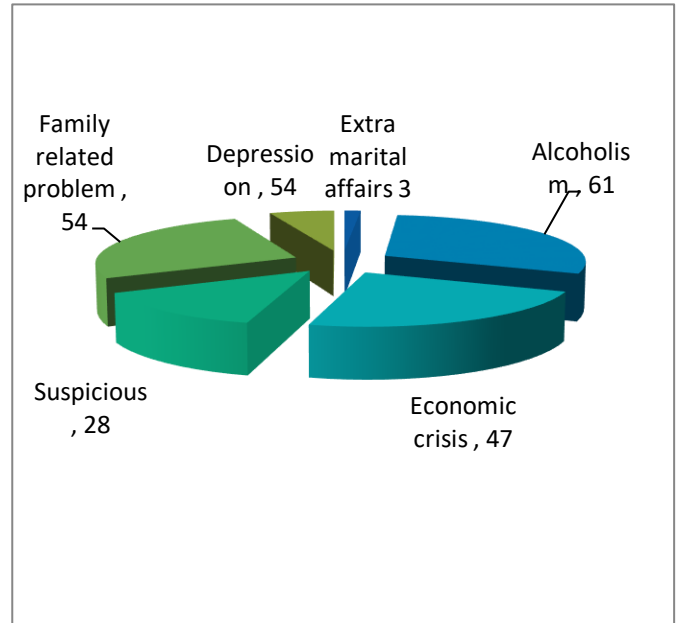
Promoting harmonious family life among people living in Nagapattinam District

## Objectives:

- To minimize family problem arising out of alcoholism ,domestic violence, dowry problem, etc...in Nagapattinam district.
- To provide information on legal rights on women and link women with resources locally available.
- To establish linkages with the police departments, DLSA, DSW, hospitals, NGOs, CBOs, etc to address issues together.

## Activities:

- During this reporting period, the project has successfully dealt with 205 cases and out of that 186 were rehabilitated with the help of supportive services.
- 1226 people got sensitized on women rights and its related education through 48 awareness programmes organized for women self help groups, adolescent girls and village stakeholders.
- Both the counsellors attended periodical meetings organized by family court and supported to deal with domestic violence cases in coordination with line departments.
- Conducted 02 subcommittee meetings and discussed about the pending cases and strategies to strengthen the project in coordination with allied department
- Sensitized 86 women group members on women rights and govt. welfare schemes.
- Conducted 90 follow ups, 120 home visits, referred 08 cases to District Legal Service Authority and 61 cases to Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts (IRCA) for further support and rehabilitation.
- The District Social Welfare Officer, Nagapattinam has visited the project and given guidance and support.



## Adaikalam – Sakthi Sadan Programme:

### Goal:

Ensuring holistic development of women and girls under distress through counseling and Rehabilitation measures in Nagapattinam District

### Objectives :

- To create social awareness on care for the homeless and the abandoned
- To ensure safe and healthy atmosphere for women and girls under distress
- To provide them information on self reliance legal matters and rehabilitation
- To establish network with other Free Legal Aid, NGOs and other Government Departments

### Activities:

- Conducted 48 awareness programmes on women rights, functions of Sakthi Sadan, dowry harassment and its legal consequences and on domestic violence Act for the women self help groups, village stakeholders and to the general community in Nagapattinam District.
- At this reporting period, 38 women in difficult circumstances were admitted newly and 32 were restored with parents/spouse/relatives.
- 82 women were supported with counselling assistance and thereby 32 were rehabilitated successfully.
- At present there were 48 women and 15 children at home involved in vocational training, recreational activities, yoga and spiritual meetings.
- All women police station, Town police station, One stop centre, Free Legal Aid and District Social Welfare Office were referred women to Sakthi Sadan Home for counselling and guidance.
- The residents were trained on vocational trades such as tailoring, Basket making, Embroidering and Paper cover making. After the training programme, they have been placed in nearby shop for internship. At this reporting period, 08 were self employed.
- Organized 04 Home committee meetings, 86 Home visits and 122 Follow ups and supported for leading happy life.
- Celebrated International Women's Day focusing on the theme "Give to Gain" in Nagapattinam with Women self help groups and village stakeholders. Morethan 200 women folk were participated and got sanitized.
- Leveraged support from nearby Primary Health Centre, General Hospital, Nagapattinam and Integrated Testing and Counselling Centre for necessary medical assistance.



- Supported the residents to avail welfare schemes from Govt. departments and celebrated several religious and local festivals with the participation of the village stakeholders.
- The District Social Welfare Officer, Nagapattinam, District Supply Officer, District Fire Officer and One stop centre officials have visited the Home, interacted with clients about the services, verified the documents and given guidance.

## **Project on Health, Road Safety, Education and Livelihood Initiatives:**

### **Goal:**

Empowering rural communities with special focus on women, adolescent, children and youth in health, education, road safety and livelihood initiatives in Mayiladuthurai, Nagapattinam and Karaikal Districts.

### **Objectives:**

- Enhance knowledge, attitudes, and practices related to reproductive health and gender issues among women and adolescent girls
- Observe important national and international days related to health and women's empowerment to foster awareness and community engagement.
- Train peer leaders to ensure long-term sustainability of project outcomes and to create a multiplier effect within the community.
- Increase awareness and access to central and state government welfare schemes through convergence camps and stakeholder engagement meetings.
- Equip final-year students with essential soft skills and spoken English training to improve their job readiness and employability.
- Conduct job fairs to connect rural youth with employment opportunities and support their career development.
- Raise public awareness on road safety and emergency preparedness targeting students and the general public.



### **Activities:**

- The project has organized women and adolescent group meetings in 05 targeted villages of Mayiladuthurai District. 80 women groups and 20 adolescent groups were revived and the records were updated successfully. The group members were educated on the purpose of meeting, BCC



sessions on health themes and benefits of attending the session in detail.

- 113 BCC sessions were taken on the topic of Nutrition & Anaemia and Menstrual Hygiene management and thereby 2241 were got benefited. Pictorial IEC materials and flip charts were used and educated the participants. During the sessions, the participants were educated on low -cost nutrition, hand washing techniques, ill-effects of open defecation, micro nutrients, menstrual hygiene practices, safe disposal and health impacts.
- Celebrated International Day of the Girl Child in Govt. Middle School at Sangamangalam village of Nagapattinam District. The programme reached to 152 students and teachers. The panchayat stakeholders, Village Health Nurse, School Headmaster, Anganwadi teachers were presided and the event was held successfully on educating the children about importance of education, good touch & bad touch -preventive measures, hygiene practices and importance of nutrition etc.. Various events were held and given prizes to the children.

- Conducted 05 free health camps in rural villages and thereby 281 were got benefited. Cold, fever, body pain, blood pressure, diabetics, Tuberculosis, skin diseases,



respiratory problems, urinary infection and other common illness were diagnosed and given treatment.

- Organized Radio (FM Programme), Karaikal on two topics such as Nutrition and Menstrual Hygiene Management and on road safety. The programme was presided by Traffic Inspector, Karaikal and Doctor from Primary Health Centre, Neravy. The programme has reached morethan 8 lakh population and it was covered 8 districts
- Spoken English and Soft Skill Sessions were held at Avvaiyar Govt. College for Women in Karaikal District. 100 students were got benefited. The sessions covered basic spoken English, conversation skill, ability to speech in English, soft skills, personality development, coping skills etc.. The College administration assigned a Coordinator to monitor presence of children in all sessions. During this reporting period, 105 spoken English and Soft skill trainings were



conducted.

- 05 single headed women were selected for car driving and supported to obtain car driving licence successfully. The project plans to leverage govt. scheme to support these women for self-employment.
- Sensitized 2374 school children on Road safety and with pictorial charts and taken pledge to follow traffic rules.
- Conducted drawing and quiz competition on Road safety in 08 schools and given prizes to students. Traffic inspector, Karaikal, Rotary club members and School teachers were participated and motivated the students to follow traffic rules for safe journey.

- The Road safety rath yatra was held in Karaikal District inaugurated by the Inspector Law & Order Mr. Lenin Bharathi, Karaikal



District. The cultural team consists of 5 members were sensitized on Road safety through cultural show and given pit notice on road safety rules to the general public. The cultural show depicted that those persons travelled with helmet were given rose and those persons travelled without helmet were caught by the Ema dharma and given pit notice on road safety and sensitised.

- The project has organized 05 convergence camps in Nagapattinam District and supported 294 marginalised people to access to govt. schemes and benefits



## **Anubhavam Home for Senior Citizens:**

### **Goal :**

Enhancing health status, social relationship and self esteem of the vulnerable elders by providing peaceful home shelter care and social awareness.

### **Objectives:**

- To enhance social awareness on elder care in the community
- To carryout social, psychological and material assistance to needy elders
- To identify neglected and socially handicapped elders in the communities
- To provide a healthy family environment to the elders admitted in home
- To ensure nutritional, medical, entertainment and other preliminary needs of elders
- To engage in resource mobilization activities.

### **Activities:**

- 51 abandoned senior citizens were taken care at free of cost by ensuring safe shelter, nutritious food, health care, yoga, recreation and counseling assistance to lead happy life.
- 12 residents were newly admitted and 13 were reunited with their families At present there are 39 residents.
- 12 free medical camps were organized and given treatment to common ailments. The project extends its gratitude to Apollo & Billion Hearts Beating Foundation for supporting with free medicines for chronic illness. Primary Health centre extended their fullest support on rendering health care assistance to all the residents to lead a healthy life.
- TB screening camp was conducted and no positive cases detected and an eye camp was organised and 04 of them got their vision back.
- The project felt pleased to extend its gratitude to American Tamil Medical Association has supported the residents with medical equipment and cot at free of cost. The residents extended their gratitude with joy.
- At this reporting period, 03 residents were covered under OAP (Old Age Pension) and 15 were covered under health Insurance.
- World Elders Day was celebrated along with District administration and like minded institutions in Nagapattinam and the residents were motivated with prizes for their inherited skills and talents.
- Periodical yoga and meditation helped the residents to be active and brisk on taking lead over the activities organized by the project at Home.



- The Multipurpose hall constructed with the support of 63 Moons Technologies Limited was successfully inaugurated by the District Collector, Nagapattinam, Chairman of Tamilnadu Fisheries development Corporation and the CEO cum Chairperson of 63 Moons Technologies Limited on 13<sup>th</sup> June 2025.



- The representative from District Legal Service Authority (DLSA), Nagapattinam visits the project periodically and educate the residents on Senior Citizens Act.
- The active residents at Home are maintaining garden and watering the plants as part of recreation. More than that, they read newspaper, watch television, hear radio, draw pictures and do handicraft work and play indoor games at leisure time.
- The American Tamil Medical Association donated medical equipment and cot to the project for the benefit of the residents and thereby all the residents extended their heartfelt gratitude to ATMA.
- At this reporting period, Secretary, Commissionate of Social Welfare, Nagapattinam, District Social Welfare Officer, District Child Protection Officer, District Civil Supply Officer, District Education Officer, District Legal Service Authority, Thasildar, Fire Service Station Master were visited the Home several times and given their guidance and suggestions.



## Ambujam Home for Senior Citizens:

### Goal:

Enhancing health status, social relationship and self esteem of the vulnerable elders by providing peaceful home shelter care and social awareness.

### Objectives:

- To enhance social awareness on elder care in the community
- To carryout social, psychological and material assistance to needy elders
- To identify neglected and socially handicapped elders in the communities
- To provide a healthy family environment to the elders admitted in home
- To ensure nutritional, medical, entertainment and other preliminary needs of elders in the home.
- To engage in resource mobilization activities.

### Activities:

- 40 vulnerable residents were taken care with love and affection by providing safe shelter, nutritious food, health care, yoga, recreation and given homely atmosphere
- 15 senior citizens were newly admitted and 15 residents were reunited with their families successfully. At present, 25 residents were taken care and given homely atmosphere.



- The American Tamil Medical Association donated medical equipment and cot to the project for the benefit of the residents and thereby all the residents extended their heartfelt gratitude to ATMA.



- The Apollo/ Billion Hearts Beating Foundation supported with

medicines for chronic infection and joining with the Thevour Primary Health Centre, periodical medical camps were organized and given treatment for the ailments of the residents.

- Special TB camp was organized and 20 residents were screened and vaccinated. Moreover, an eye camp was held where 12 residents were screened and 04 got vision back.
- In this reporting period, as part of leveraging govt. schemes for the benefit of the residents, 20 were covered under Medical Insurance and 04 were covered under Old Age Pension.
- The residents feel at home of the celebration held during this project period such as world Elders Day, Yoga Day, Religious festivals such as pongal, diwali, sarasvathi pooja, Independence day, New Year and republic day. All the residents actively participated in the events and enjoyed the day by sharing their thoughts and past feelings along with well-wishers of the project.

- As part of recreational activities, the residents were involved in gardening, art & paintings, drawing rangoli, cultural and other group activities.
- The project mobilized material donations like clothes, groceries, electrical fittings, tree saplings etc from local donors, supporters and well-wishers.
- The project was visited by the District Social Welfare Officer, District Supply Officer, Thasildar, Ward member and Extension officer and given guidance.



## **Annapoorani – Home for Senior Citizens**

### **Goal:**

Enhancing health status, social relationship and self esteem of the vulnerable elders by providing peaceful home shelter care and social awareness.

### **Objectives:**

- To enhance social awareness on elder care in the community
- To carryout social, psychological and material assistance to needy elders
- To identify neglected and socially handicapped elders in the communities
- To provide a healthy family environment to the elders admitted in home
- To ensure nutritional, medical, entertainment and other preliminary needs of elders in the home.
- To engage in resource mobilization activities.

### **Activities:**

- Supported 31 residents with safe shelter, nutritious food, yoga, meditation, recreation and counselling assistance at free of cost. 06 were newly admitted and 06 were reunited with family members. At present there are 25 residents.
- The project successfully leveraged Old Age pension for 08 residents and medical insurance for 10.
- Organized 12 free medical camps in coordination with Primary Health Centre and provided free medicine and treatment for the residents to lead a healthy life.
- The Health Department has organized TB test for entire residents and given treatment.
- The residents are actively involved in periodical yoga, reading newspaper, indoor games, group activities and gardening work.
- World Elders' Day, Yoga Day and other religious festivals were celebrated by organizing games and distributed prizes in presence of donors, well-wishers and supporters.
- The project mobilized material support such as electrical fittings, furniture, groceries and cloth items as local contribution from local donors and thanked the supporters for their continuous association with the project.
- District Collector, officials from NISD, District Social Welfare Officer, District Fire Officer, District Child Protection Officer, Member from Tamilnadu Human Right Commission, Ward member, Rotary and Lions club representatives, local industrial corporates were visited the project, interacted with residents and extended support and guidance.



## **Free Home for Senior citizens at Karaikal, Trichy and Nagapattinam (Urban):**

Free Home for Senior Citizens at Karaikal, Trichy and Nagapattinam (Urban) run with the support of local contribution and support from like minded institutions. The Home takes care of vulnerable senior citizens neglected by the society. These Homes run from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2022. The residents are provided with free shelter, nutritious food, recreation, yoga, health care and rehabilitation assistance at free of cost. There are 22 to 25 residents in each Home. The organization has applied for grant-in-aid from Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment for continuing the support without any financial constraints.

## **Puthumalar- Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts: Nagapattinam**

### **Goal:**

Rehabilitation of Drug addicts in Nagapattinam District through Medical and psychological treatment and to make it as sober

### **Objective:**

- To enrich knowledge on ill-effect of alcoholism through mass communication
- To increase the number of services rendered to alcoholic cases by 20% in one year
- To continuously assist recovered cases through periodical meetings and Alcoholic Anonymous to maintain sobriety.
- To network with related Departments and CBOs and to strengthen the services of the programme

### **Activities:**

- At this reporting period, the project has admitted 183 drug addicts and out of that 172 drug addicts were treated successfully.
- 2208 individual counseling sessions, 263 group therapies and 52 family counselling were conducted and facilitated for successful treatment. Moreover, 240 home visits and 305 follow up were made to prevent relapse.
- Besides curative programmes, the project has carried out various programmes on prevention of substance abuse in the community and thereby 3253 people were covered under 77 community outreach activities.

- Organized 12 Alcoholic Anonymous (AA) meetings chaired by AA members from Kumbakonam and educated the patients on the merits of living with sobriety.
- International Day Against Drug Abuse and illicit Trafficking was observed in coordination with customs and narcotic department in Nagapattinam District. The event created massive awareness and covered more than 875 people in the district.



- With the support from the District Child Protection Unit, Nagapattinam, the project has carried out NMBA activities under NAPDDR on prevention of substance abuse in schools, colleges, Industrial Training Institutes, women self help groups and in rural villages. Totally 59 programmes were conducted and 51196 were covered.
- The admitted addicts were involved in various indoor activities such as art & craft making, gardening and painting work as part of rehabilitation activities.
- The project staff team underwent capacity building from TTK, Chennai, online training from NISD on the topic of Detoxification, counselling techniques, Prevention and Treatment process and ensured quality of services in the centre. Moreover, the staff team also attended periodical review meeting organized by TTK, Chennai
- The District Child Protection Officer, Police Department, Health Department, Mental health board and officials from TTK were visited the project and given guidance and suggestion.

## **Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts- Karaikal:**

### **Goal:**

Ensure sobriety among addicts of Karaikal and neighboring district through medical and psychological treatment.

### **Objectives:**

- To increase the number of services rendered to alcoholic cases by 20% in one year.
- To continuously assist recovered cases so that cases of relapse is reduced by 10%.
- To organize the awareness programme on handling alcoholic cases for Government officials, private practitioners, Educational institutions and NGO's
- To network with the related departments and CBO's to strengthen the services to the entire district.

### Activities:

- 185 drug addicts were admitted and out of that 180 drug addicts were treated successfully. Conducted 2160 individual counseling, 259 group therapies, 52 family counsellings and yoga & meditations for drug addicts to make the treatment successful.
- 240 home visits and 196 regular follow up were conducted and ensured sobriety.
- Organized 48 community awareness programmes and covered 3432 people. The programme focused on addiction is a disease, impact of addiction over family, Treatment procedures and relapse management. Various IEC materials and flip charts were utilized and sensitized the general community.
- 12 Alcoholic Anonymous (AA) meetings were conducted and 12 sober patients were participated. The AA members shared about ways of sobriety and healthy life style to new patients which acted as an inspiration to entire participants.
- The project has observed International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking, World No Tobacco Day and International Yoga Day at Karaikal District by joining with Social Welfare Department, Karaikal. Nearly 1600 students participated in rally event. The people recovered from Gandhiji IRCA programme, Karaikal were awarded with medal and tree saplings. The programme was chaired by the District Collector and core govt. officials from Karaikal district.
- The staff team underwent online training organised by the NISD on counselling techniques and Yoga therapy. Moreover the staff team participated in NMBA review meeting organized by the District Collector, Karaikal and updated the status of activities.
- The Project officer of Integrated Counselling and Testing Centre (ICTC) do periodical visit to the project for orientation and testing of HIV/AIDS.
- The officials from NISD, Assistant Director, Social Welfare, Deputy Director, Social Welfare, Deputy Director (Immunization), Police and Fire Service department officials and officials from TTK were visited the project and given guidance and suggestion.



## **National Action Plan for Drug Demand Reduction (NAPDDR) – NMBA Activities**

### **Goal:**

Educate and empower young people and the community on prevention of substance abuse and support for rehabilitation

### **Objectives:**

- To sensitize the youth group on prevention of substance abuse
- To sensitize the community on ill-effects of drug abuse and its impact of addiction over family
- To network with stakeholders on addressing drug abuse and to refer addicts to rehabilitation centre for treatment

### **Activities:**

- Avvai village welfare society with the financial assistance from District Child Protection Unit, Nagapattinam, carried out various awareness programmes on prevention of substance abuse as part of Nasha Mukh Bharat Abhiyaan (a component under NAPDDR scheme) in Nagapattinam District of Tamilnadu. The programme covered school children, ITI students, college students, auto drivers, women self help groups and general population at large level.
- The pictorial charts were displayed in order and the participants were motivated to view all the charts and to observe the points exhibited in each pictorial charts. The participants actively observed the charts and learnt on ill-effects of tobacco products such as cool lip, cigarette, Hans etc., learnt on adverse impact of various drug abuse, treatment procedure of Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts (IRCA) etc..



**Awareness programme on Drug abuse prevention:**

Following to Exhibition, awareness session on drug abuse prevention was carried out with resource persons. The participants were educated on the following,

- Drug abuse and its related physical and mental problems
- Impact of addiction over family and life style
- Significance of education and managing peer pressure
- Treatment procedure in Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts (IRCA)
- Preventive measures and importance of coping skills

Totally 59 awareness programmes and events on ill-effects of drug abuse were conducted and reached out to 51196 people. In each programme, the pictorial charts were utilised and sensitized the participants.

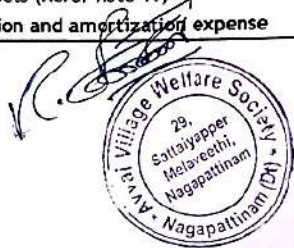
