Child Protection Project

Goal :

Prevention and elimination of child marriage and child trafficking by ensuring awareness generation and supportive services to the victims and their families

Objectives :

- To conduct outreach and awareness activities on child marriage and child trafficking issues
- To sensitize the stakeholders and promote hand holding support to address child protection issues
- To prevent and eliminate child marriage and child trafficking issues with supportive services
- To produce children in need of care and protection before child welfare committee for better rehabilitation and assistance
- To ensure linkages and support from like-minded institutions and Government departments

Activities :

- Conducted outreach and awareness activities in 50 villages and ensured 21632 people taking group pledge against child marriage and child trafficking issues.
- Sensitized on legal consequences and ill-effects of child marriage and obtained 327 undertakings, 25 persuasion and supported to file 5 FIRs and assisted 357 victims' families on prevention of child marriages.
- Promoted awareness generation on The Prohibition of Child marriage Act, 2006 among village stakeholders and as a result resolutions were passed against child marriage in panchayat level gram sabha meetings.
- 36 Child labour, child trafficking and child missing cases were addressed with allied systems and produced CNCP before Child Welfare Committee.
- Sensitized 100 days employment workers, women self help group leaders & members, village health nurses, panchayat leaders, anganwadi workers, ration shop and petty shop owners, religious leaders, school & college students and NGOs on child marriage and child trafficking issues.
- Developed pictorial IEC materials on child marriage and child trafficking issues and pasted in public gathering places.



- Conducted street play on child marriage and child trafficking issues with cultural team and sensitized the general public in all public gathering spots like bus stand, market places etc..
- In response to ‘BalVivahMukt Bharat’ campaign announced by the Women and Child Development, continuous campaign activities were held from 28th Nov 2024 and administered pledge against child marriage to all gram panchayats and schools in Nagapattinam District.
- As a result of comprehensive programmes on child marriage and child trafficking issues, the panchayats namely Sottalvannam, Pattamangalam, Manjakollai, Katharipulam and Thamaraipulam were passed resolutions in gram sabha meeting and opened name board as “Child Marriage Free Panchayat”



Campaign against child marriage

Nagapattinam: As part of the Union government's Bal Vivah Mukta Bharat (Child Marriage-Free Bharat) initiative, the Avvai Village Welfare Society (AVWS) conducted awareness campaigns in three villages of the district on Wednesday. The events, held at Samanathanpettai, Kallar, and Sottalvannam aimed to educate the public on the importance of child rights and the need to eradicate child marriage. Over 50 participants in each village took pledge to prevent child marriages, report any attempts to government authorities, and advocate for children's education and safety. R Manivannan, project coordinator, led campaign.

Vidiyal - Family Counseling Centre :

Goal :

Promoting harmonious family life among people living in Nagapattinam District

Objectives :

- To minimize family problem arising out of alcoholism ,domestic violence, dowry problem, etc...in Nagapattinam district.
- To provide information on legal rights on women and link women with resources locally available.
- To establish linkages with the police departments, DLSA, DSW, hospitals, NGOs, CBOs, etc to address issues together.

Activities :


- 239 cases were registered and out of that 218 cases were rehabilitated successfully in coordination with supportive services.
- Organized 48 awareness programmes on women rights, legal protection, women related govt. schemes for 100 days employment workers, self help groups, federation leaders, college students and thereby 2101 people got sensitized.

The counsellors attended periodical meetings conducted by All women police station, family court and collectorate and supported to deal with domestic violence cases in coordination with line departments.

- Organized 02 subcommittee meetings and discussed about the pending cases and strategies to strengthen the project in coordination with allied department

Conducted 96 follow ups, 130 home visits, referred 14 cases to District Legal Service Authority (DLSA) and 63 cases to Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts (IRCA) for further support and rehabilitation.

The District Social Welfare Officer, Nagapattinam has visited the project and given guidance and support.

Adaikalam–Sakthi Sadan Programme :

Goal :

Ensuring holistic development of women and girls under distress through counseling and Rehabilitation measures in Nagapattinam District

Objectives :

- To create social awareness on care for the homeless and the abandoned
- To ensure safe and healthy atmosphere for women and girls under distress
- To provide them information on self reliance legal matters and rehabilitation
- To establish network with other Free Legal Aid, NGOs and other Government Departments

Activities :

- At this reporting period, the project supported 96 women and 36 children by providing safe shelter, nutritious food, medicines, yoga, recreation and counseling assistance to lead a dignified life. 61 were newly admitted and 55 residents were discharged. At present, 41 women and 11 children are taken care at Home.
- As part of rehabilitation, 48 were restored with parents/spouse/ relatives and 07 were self employed.
- Conducted 39 outreach and awareness programmes on women rights, domestic violence Act, Women helpline, functions of Sakthisadan and One stop centre and thereby 4382 members got benefited.
- The residents were trained on vocational trades such as tailoring, Basket making, Embroidering and Paper cover making. After the training programme, they have been placed in nearby shop for internship.
- Organized 04 Home committee meetings, 122 Home visits and 130 Follow ups and supported for leading happy life.
- Leveraged support from nearby Primary Health Centre, General Hospital, Nagapattinam and Integrated Testing and Counselling Centre for necessary medical assistance.
- Supported the residents to avail welfare schemes from Govt. departments and celebrated several religious and local festivals with the participation of the village stakeholders.
- The Joint Director, Department of Social Welfare, District Social Welfare Officer, Nagapattinam, District Supply Officer, District Fire Officer and One stop centre officials have visited the Home, interacted with clients about the services, verified the documents and given guidance.





Anubhavam Home for Senior Citizens :

Goal :

Enhancing health status, social relationship and self esteem of the vulnerable elders by providing peaceful home shelter care and social awareness.

Objectives :

- To enhance social awareness on elder care in the community
- To carryout social, psychological and material assistance to needy elders
- To identify neglected and socially handicapped elders in the communities
- To provide a healthy family environment to the elders admitted in home
- To ensure nutritional, medical, entertainment and other preliminary needs of elders
- To engage in resource mobilization activities.

Activities :

- At this reporting period, the project supported 48 abandoned senior citizens by providing safe shelter, nutritious food, health care, yoga, recreation and counseling assistance to lead happy life.
- 08 residents were newly admitted, 06 were reunited with their families and 02 residents expired due to oldage. At present there are 40 residents (Male 10 and Female 30).
- Hon'ble Minister for Social Welfare, Secretary, Department of Social Welfare, District Collector, Nagapattinam and Member of Legislative Assembly (MLA, Nagapattinam) were visited the project, interacted with residents and observed the activities of handicraft items made by the residents and at the end given the Registration Certificate under the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007 to the project.
- Organized periodical free medical camps for the residents and given treatment for their ailments. The Apollo Chennai and nearby Primary Health centre extended their fullest support on rendering health care assistance to all the residents to lead a healthy life. 02 of them done cataract operation and got their vision back.
- ALIMCO has supported the residents with wheel chair, walker, Ear machine and hand stick at free of cost. The residents extended their gratitude with joy.
- Periodical yoga and meditation help the residents active and brisk on taking lead over the activities organized by the project at Home.



- 36 residents were covered under Old Age Pension and 24 were covered under Ayushman Bharat Medical Insurance
- The active elders at Home are maintaining a garden and watering the plants as part of recreation. More than that, reading newspaper, watching television, hearing radio, drawing pictures and doing handicraft work and playing indoor games at leisure time.
- Celebrated World Elders Day at massive level in coordination with District Administration, Nagapattinam. The NGOs running Old Age Home in Nagapattinam took part in the celebration and the District Revenue Officer and District Social Welfare Officer taken lead over the activities and awarded the residents by observing the cultural events.
- The project leveraged material donations like household materials, clothes, yoga mats, emergency lights, water filter and entertainment items. The kind hearted donors were thanked in person and through letter communication.
- To enhance additional facilities for the residents for doing yoga, meditation, medical camps and recreational activities, the project has leveraged support from 63 moons technologies India and other local donors and initiated the construction work. The inauguration of the Multipurpose hall is scheduled to be held in the month of April 2025.
- At this reporting period, the Deputy Collector, Nagapattinam, District Social Welfare Officer, District Child Protection Officer, Assistant Nodal officer of National Health Mission, Municipal Commissioner, District Civil Supply Officer, District Education Officer, Thasildar, Fire Service Station master were visited the Home several times and given their guidance and suggestions.





Ambujam Home for Senior Citizens :

Goal :

Enhancing health status, social relationship and self esteem of the vulnerable elders by providing peaceful home shelter care and social awareness.

Objectives :

- To enhance social awareness on elder care in the community
- To carryout social, psychological and material assistance to needy elders
- To identify neglected and socially handicapped elders in the communities
- To provide a healthy family environment to the elders admitted in home
- To ensure nutritional, medical, entertainment and other preliminary needs of elders in the home.

Activities :

- The project AmbujamHome for Senior Citizens has taken care of 48vulnerable residents and given homely atmosphere
- 23Elders were newly admitted to the Home 23 residents were reunited with their families successfully. At present, 25 residents (Male 08Female-17) were taken care and given homely atmosphere.
- In coordination with Apollo and Thevour Primary Health Centre, periodical medical camps were organized and given treatment for the ailments of the residents. 05 residents were done cataract operation and got their vision back.
- 19 residents were covered under Ayushman Bharat Medical Insurance and 17 were covered under Old Age Pension.
- World Elders Day, Yoga Day, Religious festivals such as pongal, diwali, sarasvathipooja and Independence day, New Year and republic day were celebrated with the participation of several stakeholders and well-wishers of the project
- Social audit was held and at the end of auditing, the findings were shared in gram sabha meeting represented by various stakeholders and passed resolutions for further enhancement of the project.



- The solar panel installation was inaugurated successfully by the supporter 63 Moons Technologies India and dedicated the services to the residents with joy.
- As part of recreational activities, the residents were involved in gardening, art & paintings, drawing rangoli, cultural and other group activities.
- Hon'ble Minister for Social Welfare, Secretary, Department of Social Welfare, District Collector, Nagapattinam and Member of Legislative Assembly (MLA, Nagapattinam) were given the Registration Certificate under the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007 to the project.
- The project mobilized material donations like clothes, groceries, electrical fittings, tree saplings etc from local donors, supporters and well-wishers.
- The project was visited by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, New Delhi, Deputy Collector, Nagapattinam, District Social Welfare Officer, District Child Protection Officer, District Supply Officer, Thasildar, Ward member and Extension officer and given guidance.



Annapoorani – Home for Senior Citizens :

Goal :

Enhancing health status, social relationship and self esteem of the vulnerable elders by providing peaceful home shelter care and social awareness.

Objectives :

- To enhance social awareness on elder care in the community
- To carryout social, psychological and material assistance to needy elders
- To identify neglected and socially handicapped elders in the communities
- To provide a healthy family environment to the elders admitted in home
- To ensure nutritional, medical, entertainment and other preliminary needs of elders in the home.
- To engage in resource mobilization activities.



Activities :

- During the project period, the Annapoorani Home for Senior Citizens supported 42 residents with safe shelter, nutritious food, yoga, meditation, recreation and counselling assistance at free of cost. 17 were newly admitted and 17 were reunited with family members. At present there are 09 male and 16 female residents.
- Organized periodical free medical camps in coordination with Primary Health Centre and provided free medicine and treatment for the residents to lead a healthy life.
- Periodical yoga, reading newspaper, indoor games, group activities, gardening work were conducted for the residents and kept their body and soul healthy.
- World Elders' Day, Yoga Day and other religious festivals were celebrated by organizing games and distributed prizes in presence of donors, well-wishers and supporters.
- The project mobilized material support such as electrical fittings, furniture, groceries and cloth items as local contribution from local donors and thanked the supporters for their continuous association with the project.
- During this reporting period, District Social Welfare Officer, District Fire Officer, Ward member, Rotary and Lions club representatives, local industrial corporates were visited the project, interacted with residents and extended support and guidance.



Free Home for Senior citizens at Karaikal, Trichy and Nagapattinam (Urban):

Considering the felt need and crisis situation of the area, Avvai village welfare society has initiated Free Home for Senior Citizens in Karaikal District of Puducherry Nagapattinam (Urban) of Nagapattinam District and at Trichy. The Homes are running since 1st April 2023. The Home serves for the elderly who are deserted and neglected from the community. There are 22 to 25 residents in each Home. The Home runs with local contribution and expects support from the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, New Delhi for continuing the assistance without any financial constraints.

Puthumalar- Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts : Nagapattinam

Goal :

Rehabilitation of Drug addicts in Nagapattinam District through Medical and psychological treatment and to make it as sober

Objectives :

- To enrich knowledge on ill-effect of alcoholism through mass communication
- To increase the number of services rendered to alcoholic cases by 20% in one year
- To continuously assist recovered cases through periodical meetings and Alcoholic Anonymous to maintain sobriety.
- To network with related Departments and CBOs and to strengthen the services of the programme

Activities :

- The project admitted 180 drug addicts and provided medical and psychological treatment, out of that 175 drug addicts were treated successfully.
- Conducted 2160 individual counseling sessions, 260 group therapies and 52 family counselling and facilitated for successful treatment.
- 232 home visits and 209 follow up were made to prevent relapse. Totally 175 cases were fully recovered at this year.
- Conducted 48 awareness programme on ill-effect of addiction to high-risk groups and thereby 2956 members were participated and benefited. As a result, 22 cases were referred to the project
- Organized 12 Alcoholic Anonymous (AA) meetings chaired by AA members from Kumbakonam and educated the patients on the merits of living with sobriety.
- International Day Against Drug Abuse and illicit Trafficking was observed in coordination with customs and narcotic department in Nagapattinam District by involving college students. The superintendent of Police, Nagapattinam and the District administration officials were participated and made the event a grant success. Through rally, the students crossed the important streets and created massive awareness on drug abuse prevention by issuing handbills. The event covered more than 2500 people in the district.





- As per circular received from the Under Secretary to the Government of India, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Avvai village welfare society has conducted several NMBA activities on the theme 'Viksit Bharat ka Mantra, Bharat hoNashe se Swatantra' during 78th Independence Day Celebration in Nagapattinam District of Tamilnadu.
- NMBA Pledge Taking activities were conducted in IRCA centre and in Colleges. The participants were actively participated and taken the pledge with commitment. The participants were educated on preventive measures of drug abuse, their role to supportive services and NMBA campaign activities.
- The project staff team underwent capacity building from TTK, Chennai, online training from NISD on the topic of Detoxification, counseling techniques, Prevention and Treatment process and ensured quality of services in the centre.
- The NCDAP, NISD has organized online competitions on creative art work on 24th June 2024. From Pudumalar- IRCA programme, 06 recovered drug users participated and submitted their paintings through online.
- The staff team of Pudumalar – IRCA programme has participated in NMBA Online quiz competition and received certificates. The competition stimulated their interest towards learning new things on drug and its related components.
- The officials from NISD, District Child Protection Officer, District Social Welfare Officer, Police Department, Health Department, Mental health board and officials from TTK were visited the project and given guidance and suggestion.



Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts- Karaikal:

Goal :

Ensure sobriety among addicts of Karaikal and neighboring district through medical and psychological treatment.

Objectives :

- To increase the number of services rendered to alcoholic cases by 20% in one year.
- To continuously assist recovered cases so that cases of relapse is reduced by 10%.
- To organize the awareness programme on handling alcoholic cases for Government officials, private practitioners, Educational institutions and NGO's
- To network with the related departments and CBO's to strengthen the services to the entire district.

Activities :

- During the reporting period, the centre has admitted 184 drug addicts out of that 180 drug addicts were treated successfully. Conducted 2160 individual counseling, 259 group therapy, 51 family counselling and yoga & meditations for drug addicts to make the treatment successful. 240 home visits and 223 regular follow up were conducted and ensured sobriety. The relapse cases were identified through Home visits and they were motivated and treated under relapse management treatment.
- The project organized 43 awareness programmes focussing on key topics such as Addiction is a disease, impact of addiction over family, Treatment procedures and community management.
- Flip charts, handbills, pictorial posters and flex banners are used to educate the participants. The school & ITI students, women self help groups, 100 days employment workers, sanitary workers, nursing students, volunteers and general public totally 3432 were sensitized on drug abuse prevention and functions of IRCA.



- 12 Alcoholic Anonymous (AA) meetings were conducted and 25 sober patients were participated. AA members from Kumbakonam and Mayiladuthurai shared about their achievements with new patients. This supported the new patients to see the merits to stay away from alcohol. This enhanced their motivation to stay sober and improve the quality of their lives.

As part of NMBA campaign, International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking was observed at Karaikal District. Social Welfare Department, Avvai village welfare society and NSS has organised the programme. Nearly 600 students participated in rally event and the programme was presided by Honourable Minister for Transport, Puducherry. The people recovered from Gandhiji IRCA programme, Karaikal were awarded with medal and tree saplings by our respectable Transport Minister, District Collector, Deputy Collector and Assistant Director, Social Welfare Department. At this special event, the students were educated on the theme "Evidence is clear, Invest in prevention" Social welfare inspector and IRCA staff were participated and made the event grant success.



- As per the guidance of the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, New Delhi, conducted activities on "MeriMatti Mara Desh" and NMBA at Karaikal by involving nursing students, women group members with the participation of Govt. stakeholders and generated awareness on drug abuse prevention.
- Rally event was organized considering World No Tobacco Day at Karaikal by involving 150 Nursing students and sensitized the public about tobacco products and its ill-effects by distributing handbills and awareness posters.


